SECTION 1: The Minutes for the meeting of November 22, 1996 copies of which had been previously mailed to each member of the Commission, were approved.

SECTION 2: The Commission unanimously passed a motion accepting a report by the Department concerning the sale of right of way property - land, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 3: The Commission unanimously passed a motion amending the July 26 and August 29, 1996 allocation of Federal and State Mass Transit Funds, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 4: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving a resolution for replacement of deficient bridges, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 5: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional resurfacing work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 6: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing bituminous retreatment contracts to include additional resurfacing work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 11: On motion of Commissioner Goodstein, duly seconded the Commission unanimously passed a motion adopting the funding allocation plan for the Federal-Aid construction program for fiscal year 1998, as shown in the Appendix. Chairman Limehouse cast proxy votes in favor of this motion for Commissioners Mullinax and Self.

SECTION 12: On motion of Commissioner Jefferson, seconded by Commissioner Whitehead, the Commission passed a motion by a vote of 6 to 1 accepting the recommendation of the Department to continue to use the guide share formula, based on population, for determining the proportion of system upgrade funding available for each Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the rural areas of the state. Eight options were considered including the current method Option A which was accepted, as shown in the Appendix. Chairman Limehouse cast proxy votes for Commissioners Mullinax and Self in favor of this motion.

SECTION 13: On motion of Commissioner Jefferson, seconded by Commissioner Whitehead, the Commission unanimously passed a motion appointing Elizabeth S. Mabry as Interim Director for the SCDOT effective January 3, 1997, with all the power and authority of the Director. Chairman Limehouse cast proxy votes for Commissioners Mullinax and Self in favor of this motion.

SECTION 14: On motion of Commissioner Jefferson, seconded by Commissioner Goodstein, the Commission passed a motion approving the following resolution naming the SC 60/I-26 interchange at Irmo the "S. Lyman Whitehead Interchange". Chairman Limehouse read a letter from Senator Joe Wilson requesting this action. Commissioner Whitehead abstained from voting on this motion.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, S. Lyman Whitehead, of Irmo, ably represents Congressional District 2 as a member of the South Carolina Transportation Commission; and

WHEREAS, since his election in 1994 to serve as a member of the newly restructured Commission, he has demonstrated energetic and effective leadership during a time most critical to the future of transportation in South Carolina, as the Commission seeks new sources of revenue and innovative means of financing and constructing major road and bridge projects; and

WHEREAS, he has previously served as chairman of State Protection and Advocacy for the Handicapped Commission, and as a member of the state Human Affairs Commission, and is a past chairman of the Lexington County Republican Party, and has rendered valuable service in these and in other capacities; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Whitehead has work tirelessly for the betterment of transportation facilities throughout the state, and particularly within the Second Congressional District; and

WHEREAS, he is a champion of the environment, and has served as chairman of Commission's SC Vegetation Maintenance Task Force, during which time the South Carolina Department of Transportation has received national recognition for its Adopt-A-Highway and Wildflower programs; and

WHEREAS, among the chief projects which he has advanced are the widening of SC 60 at Irmo and upgrading the SC 60/I-26 interchange, projects which are currently under construction;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the South Carolina Transportation Commission, in meeting duly assembled, hereby names the SC 60/I-26 interchange at Irmo the "S. Lyman Whitehead Interchange", in commemoration of his tireless efforts and service for the betterment of transportation in Congressional District 2 and throughout the State.

SECTION 15: On motion of Commissioner Whitehead, seconded by Commissioner Goodstein, the Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the request of the Myrtle Beach Island Property Owners Association regarding the "Myrtle Island Bridge" as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 16: On motion of Commissioner Goodstein, seconded by Commissioner Whitehead, the Commission passed a motion approving the following resolution for Senator Ernie Passailaigue. Chairman Limehouse abstained from voting on this motion.

SURPLUS RIGHT OF WAY PROPERTY - LAND

1. File 32.761/40.147A - Route I-26 - Lexington County

The Department acquired right of way for construction of improvements to Route I-26 and Road S-671 (Piney Grove Road) in Lexington County, under File 32.761, by Condemnation Notice dated June 10, 1993 from B. P. Oil, Inc., now BP Exploration and Oil, Inc.

During negotiations by our Legal Section with the adjoining owner, Baker and Baker, et al, an agreement was reached that the Department would convey excess right of way to Baker and Baker, et al, as settlement due to the damages to their property by the change in access of the entrance ramp to Route I-26. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 0.92 of an acre of land to Baker and Baker, a South Carolina General Partnership was executed on November 12, 1996, for consideration of \$160,648.00.

2. File 23.245A - Route I-85 - Greenville County

The Department acquired right of way for construction of improvements along Route I-85 and Lenhardt Road Relocation in Greenville County, under File 23.245A, by Condemnation Notice dated October 12, 1994 from James David Jordan, Sr.

During negotiations by our District Engineering Office with the adjacent landowner, an agreement was reached that the Department would convey a portion of the right of way to the adjoining owner in exchange of control of access. Therefore, a gratis quitclaim deed conveying approximately 0.06 of an acre of land to James David Jordan, Sr., was executed on November 18, 1996.

3. Project No. SED 1288 - Road S-28 - Horry County

By virtue of the Belt Line Act No. 195 of 1941, the Department added Road S-28 in Horry County to the State Highway System.

Upon a request from the Horry County Officials to relocate Road S-28 for intersection improvements, the Department agreed to the relocation of Road S-28 and decided that we could relinquish the abandoned right of way to the adjoining owners. Therefore, a gratis quitclaim deed conveying approximately 0.74 of an acre of land to the Myrtle Beach Farms Company, Inc., was executed on November 19, 1996.

4. MSC File 87 - Route 74 - Chester County

The Department purchased property from John G. White by Title to Real Estate dated May 15, 1941, under MSC File 87, for the purpose of a maintenance shop site in Chester County.

At the request of the City of Chester via our Legal Section to purchase this surplus property, it was determined that the Department no longer needed this maintenance shop and could relinquish it. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 4.0 acres of land to the City of Chester was executed on November 22, 1996, for consideration of \$39,000.00.

5. File 23.650 - U. S. Route 29 - Greenville County

The Department acquired right of way for construction of U. S. Route 29 in Greenville County, under FA Project 242-A, by Condemnation Notice dated August 17, 1938 from B. F. Flynn.

At the request of an adjoining owner to purchase a portion of the excess right of way along U. S. Route 29, it was determined by our Engineering Sections that the Department could reduce a portion of this right of way. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 0.21 of an acre of land to Thomas K. Norris was executed on November 22, 1996, for consideration of \$12,610.00.

6. MSC File 163 - Road S-712 - Orangeburg County

The Department purchased property from Ellore School District No. 7, by its Trustees, W. B. Bookhart, Chairman; Harold L. Felder, Secretary; T. T. McEachern, L. E. Shuler and Ulmer Weeks by Title to Real Estate dated December 3, 1958, under MSC File 163, for the purpose of a section shed site in Orangeburg County.

At the request of the Town of Ellore to purchase the Ellore Section Shed site for use by their Streets and Sanitation Department as well as their Fire Department, it was determined by the Department along with the Budget and Control Board's approval that this section shed site was no longer needed and could be relinquished. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 1.95 acres of land to the Town of Ellore was executed on November 22, 1996, for consideration of \$6,550.00.

7. File 4.760 - U. S. Route 76/SC Route 28 - Anderson County

The Department acquired right of way for construction of U. S. Route 76 in Anderson County, under File 4.495, by Right of Way Easement dated May 20, 1960 from Homer Ballenger.

Upon a request from an adjoining owner to purchase a portion of the right of way located at the southwestern quadrant of U. S. Route 76/SC Route 28 and Woody Road, it was reviewed by our Engineering Sections and determined that the Department could reduce this right of way but must retain a 50' x 50' triangular area at this intersection. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 0.07 of an acre of land to the CPLD, LLC was executed on November 26, 1996, for consideration of \$1,000.00.

8. File 14.389 - Route I-95 - Clarendon County

The Department acquired right of way for construction of Route I-95 and Road S-23 in Clarendon County, under File 14.389, by Right of Way Easement dated March 16, 1965 from L. C. Prothro.

At the request of an adjoining owner via our District Engineering Office to acquire a frontage road since the roadbed has become a nuisance, it was determined by our Engineering Sections that the Department could relinquish this earth frontage road. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 0.79 of an acre of land to JEF Construction and Goldsmith Properties, L. P. was executed on November 26, 1996, for consideration of \$990.00.

9. MSC File 166 - SC Route 210 - Orangeburg County

The Department purchased property from G. W. Weathers, Sr., Hampton A. Whetsell, T. F. Riley, Augustus Davis and R. J. Berry, Jr., Trustees of Bowman School District No. 2 by Title to Real Estate dated February 3, 1961, under MSC File 166, for the purpose of a maintenance shop site in Orangeburg County.

At the request of Orangeburg County Officials to purchase the Bowman Maintenance Shop site, it was determined by the Department along with the Budget and Control Board's approval that this maintenance shop site was no longer needed and could be relinquished. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 2.40 acres of land to the County of Orangeburg was executed on November 26, 1996, for consideration of \$8,050.00.

10. MSC File 178 - U. S. Route 178 - Orangeburg County

The Department purchased property from Sue W. Cuttino by Title to Real Estate dated October 22, 1966, under MSC File 178, for the purpose of a section shed site in Orangeburg County.

At the request of Orangeburg County Officials to purchase the North Section Shed site, it was determined by the Department along with the Budget and Control Board's approval that this maintenance shop site was no longer needed and could be relinquished, since maintenance personnel in this area report to the St. Matthews Maintenance Shop. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 3.469 acres of land to the County of Orangeburg was executed on November 26, 1996, for consideration of \$39,100.00.

11. File 40.430A - U. S. Route 601 - Richland County

The Department acquired right of way for construction of Route I-26, under Project 387C by Deed to Right of Way from R. C. Hamer, and Road S-409, under File 40.404 by Deed to Right of Way from J. C. Lanham in Greenville County.

During negotiations with an adjacent owner, an agreement was reached that the Department would convey the abandoned portion of Road S-409 in exchange of right of way for U. S. Route 601 and SC Route 764. Therefore, a gratis quitclaim deed conveying a total of 7.478 acres of land to Union Camp was executed on November 26, 1996.

12. File 42.254A - Route I-85 - Spartanburg County

In 1951, during acquisition of right of way for construction of improvements on Alternate Route 29 (now SC Route 129) in Spartanburg County, under File 42.327, the Department acquired right of way from Esten C. Taylor and J. William Taylor by Deed to Right of Way dated February 12, 1951.

At the request of an adjoining owner to purchase an abandoned roadbed, it was determined that the Department no longer needed this old right of way for Alternate Route 29 and could relinquish it. Therefore, a quitclaim deed conveying approximately 0.95 of an acre of land to the Fay U. McCall was executed on November 26, 1996, for consideration of \$1,500.00.

This matter is reported to the Commission in accordance with the requirements of Code Section 57-5-340.

RESOLUTION

DECLARING INTENT PURSUANT TO UNITED STATES TREASURY DEPARTMENT INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE, REGULATION 1.150-2 WITH RESPECT TO THE FINANCING OF THE REPLACEMENT OF STRUCTURALLY DEFICIENT BRIDGES AND AUTHORIZING COMPLIANCE WITH S.C. CODE, TITLE 57, CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE 9, TO THE EXTENT APPLICABLE

WHEREAS, the South Carolina Department of Transportation has undertaken a program to improve the safety of the highway system for school bus and other traffic by replacing structurally deficient bridges which are being financed with the proceeds of federally tax-exempt obligations; and

WHEREAS, the South Carolina Department of Transportation has issued \$50 million of a total \$80 million of tax-exempt obligations, previously approved by the South Carolina Department of Transportation Commission through resolution at their March 16, 1995 meeting, to finance this program of bridge replacement; and

WHEREAS, various factors will cause timing differences between the issuance of such bonds in relation to the time when expenditures for the final group of bridges in this program must be made;

WHEREAS, the South Carolina Department of Transportation Commission is mindful of the fact that, in order for the use of federally tax-exempt bond proceeds to be considered "expended" for purposes of United States Treasury Department Internal Revenue Service Regulation 1.150-2 ("Reg. 1.150-2") when used to reimburse the Department of expenditures made prior to the issuance of the obligations, certain conditions, including the making of a declaration of intent to reimburse such expenditures, must be met;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the South Carolina Department of Transportation Commission in meeting duly assembled,

THAT, the South Carolina Department of Transportation hereby funds the construction of structurally deficient bridges with the financing to be provided by general obligations bonds to be reasonable pursuant to SC Code 57-5-1330; and

THAT, the South Carolina Department of Transportation reasonably expects and intends to reimburse certain expenditures made on or after the date of January 1, 1997 for the purpose of replacing structurally deficient bridges from the proceeds of federally tax-exempt obligations issued as State Highway Bonds, not to exceed \$30 million.

EXTENSION OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS

It is recommended that the Commission approve the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work as follows:

FLORENCE COUNTY:

Contract of L. Dean Weaver Construction Company, Inc. - File No. 21.143A - extended to include an additional section of State Project C-143A (File No. 21.143A) to include the grading, drainage, and asphalt concrete surfacing of 0.076 mile on Road S-624 (Sumter Street) in Lake City at the intersection of US 52.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 46,530.80

LEE COUNTY:

Contract of A. P. Bowden Construction, Inc. - File No. 31.466 - extended to include an additional section of State Project C-731 (File No. 28.731) consisting of the grading and asphalt surfacing of the parking area of West Lee School adjacent to Road S-182.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 28,206.55

RICHLAND COUNTY:

Contract of REA Construction Company - File No. 40.397A - extended to include an additional section of Project FAP STP-UR40(I) (File No. 40.397A) consisting of the repair work and placement of thermoplastic pavement markings of .51 miles on O'Neil Court from end of existing project limits and extending north to US 1 (Two Notch Road).

Estimated Cost of Extension \$11,579.50

These extensions were authorized by the Department prior to formal approval by the Commission since the adjacent work had reached such a stage of completion that the contractors involved could not accept the additional work unless it were authorized without delay.

COLLETON COUNTY:

Contract of J. F. Cleckley Company, Inc. - File No. 15.10961 - extended to include an additional section of Project C-613 (File No. 15.613) consisting of the resurfacing of 1.54 km on Road S-15-21 from SC Route 61 to End of State Maintenance.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 65,606.66
CORRECTION: Extension was previously approved by Commission August 29, 1996. This is to correct contractor to J. F. Cleckley Company, Inc. in lieu of REA Construction Company.

Contract of REA Construction Company - File No. 15.10961 - extended to include an additional section of Project C-612L (File No. 15.612L) consisting of the resurfacing of .457 km on Sanders Street from US 17A to S-15-36; .111 km on Walter Street from S-15-121 to SC 63; .281 km on Lucas Street from Sanders Street to SC 63; .284 km on Brownleh Street from S-15-168 to S-15-121; .296 km on Rivers Street from S-15-168 to S-15-121; .287 km on Bay Street from S-15-168 to S-15-121; .217 km on Lemacks Street from SC 63 to Chaplin Street; .249 km on Charles Street from SC 63 to Lemacks Street; .211 km on Neyle Street from Miller Street to S-15-55; .360 km on Miller Street from SC 63 to End of City Maintenance; .161 km on Magnolia Street from US 17A to Miller Street; .071 km on Bellinger Street from Miller Street to S-15-803; .303 km on Church Street from Magnolia Street to S-15-290; .024 km on Fishburne Street from US 17A to Church Street; and .164 km on Tracy Street from US 17A to S-15-215.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$85,000.00
CORRECTION: Extension was previously approved by Commission August 29, 1996. This is to correct contractor to J. F. Cleckley Company, Inc. in lieu of REA Construction Company.

These extensions were authorized by the Department prior to formal approval by the Commission since the adjacent work had reached such a stage of completion that the contractor involved could not accept the additional work unless it were authorized without delay.
