- WHEREAS,** companies from the Republic of China on Taiwan have invested almost \$2 billion in our economy over the years while providing high-quality employment opportunities to South Carolina workers; and
- WHEREAS,** as a result of their common commitment to peace and prosperity, the State of South Carolina and the Republic of China on Taiwan have enjoyed friendly and fruitful relations for many years, maintaining favorable trade relations, strong cultural ties, and extensive educational exchanges; and
- WHEREAS,** on November 10, 1981, the Province of Taiwan of the Republic of China on Taiwan entered into a sister-state relationship with the State of South Carolina.
