WHEREAS, volunteers and service providers in our communities are dedicated to providing care to sexual assault survivors through 24-hour hotlines, counseling, support groups, advocacy, medical care, and education; and

WHEREAS, the 2015 observance of Sexual Assault Awareness Month calls attention to sexual violence and educates the public and individuals on how to prevent, treat, and heal from this personal violation.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim April 2015 as
