AGREEMENT WITH ATE MANAGEMENT AND SERVICE COMPANY

At the June 15, 1989, meeting of the Commission, the Department was given authorization for the expenditure of Urban Mass Transportation Section 18/Rural Transit Assistance Program (RTAP) funds (\$86,013). The program is 100% federally funded.

One of the components of this continuing RTAP program is conducting transit management and governing board workshops. To implement this component, the Commission also authorized the Department on 9/22/88 (Item #: PT-045) to enter into an agreement with ATE Management & Service Company for curriculum development and implementation for the '88-'89 program year. As part of the initial bid/consultant procurement process, the request for proposals and the contract allowed for a two-year extension given that the Department was satisfied with work performed and funds were available. ATE successfully completed their work to the Department's satisfaction and UMTA has allocated additional RTAP funding for FY '89-'90.

It is therefore, requested that the Commission authorize the Department to enter into an agreement with ATE Management and Service Company to develop and implement training curricula associated with 1990 transit management and governing board workshops for a contract maximum of \$31,517. A contract extension for FY '90-'91 may be allowed if the Department is satisfied with work performed and RTAP funding is available to support the project.

The next order of business is the adoption of the Minutes.

Commissioner Crow:

Mr. Chairman could I be heard on that just a minute and I really don't know how to bring it up because I've talked to Roger a time or two about what we do and what we actually put in the Minutes. And I know everything's transcribed - not transcribed but taped at this particular meeting. Last time I voiced some real concern and I said I certainly support the Department's position in what they did relative to the Florence/Conway Connector from I-95 to the Beach and I respect what the Department did and I expect to stand by it, however, as a member of this Commission, I see nothing in the Minutes of October 19, 1989 where I voiced some concern about a project of this magnitude, what had been expected, that the Commission really had no input in what happened there. And Mr. Rideoutte explained to me. He has an opinion that that's inhouse and it's an engineering decision maybe and that the Commission -- it's not policy. I feel like that if a project such as the Conway/Florence Connector was of such magnitude and some of us had attended a lot of public hearings. Some of us had did a lot of corresponding on it, we've talked to local chamber of commerce people. I would have liked to have had some small part in that decision if it was a decision I think we should have made as a Commission and not necessary. I just want that somewhere in these Minutes. Maybe there's no place to put but it's at least now on tape.

Commissioner Truluck:

Let me add to that. I think the whole thing, even though it was being discussed among the staff, when the letter came out I got a copy of a letter that was sent to a Senator. I felt like that really it should have been the Commissioners that were at least involved in the area should have had some recollection before it was written to somebody else of the fact that it was going to be put on an indefinite hold. I think that we should have been involved somewhere in knowing what was being done.

Commissioner Mack:

Let me ask something to clarify my understanding. You're really talking about the putting on hold and you're talking about the whole project.

Commissioner Crow:

I'm just talking about the part from Conway to Florence. The same thing he's talking about.

Commissioner Mack:

You're talking about the same thing.

Commissioner Crow:

What I'm saying is that decision was made by the staff, the Executive Director and the engineer, Highway Engineer. That decision was made. As far as I know, the Commission has no official yes or no. We probably don't have to. Mr. Rideoutte explained his position. He also explained it was an oversight that I didn't get a letter, which I understand. I read about it in the State newspaper the morning I got the telephone call. And needless to say I didn't get the telephone call from the Highway Department telling me what they'd done. I got the telephone call from people that didn't like what they'd done. But that's neither here nor there. I just want it put somewhere in the permanent records.

Commissioner Mack: In the Minutes?

Commissioner Crow:

I guess the Minutes that it was done

Commissioner McKnight:

Mr. Chairman I share the same sentiments as Commissioner Truluck shared on that problem in District Two.

Commissioner Rhodes:

Mr. Chairman I'd like to go a little bit further than what Mr. Crow's gone. I'd like to find out who makes the decision as to what's policy and what's operations as far as the Commission is concerned. Is it the Executive Director? The State Highway Engineer? or is it the Commission? It's my understanding that this Commission sets policy and then monitors the management of the Department to see that that policy is carried out. Who determines what's policy and what's not. That's what I'd like to know.

Mr. Rideoutte:

And I can't really answer that other than to say that the Manual that the Commission adopted I guess two or three years ago would address that to some degree. You'd just have to read that -- all of us would have to read that -- and interpret as best we could.

Commissioner Rhodes:

It's not in the Manual.

Mr. Rideoutte:

If it's not in there, I would say that it would be the

Mr. Rideoutte:

Commission's responsibility to strengthen that Manual if they felt that it needed to be strengthened. Because that has always been -- it was much more so before that Manual was adopted. I think that was an attempt to get something in writing as to what the Commissioner's role and what is the staff's role and what is not. Getting back to that section that we put on hold I would say. Traditionally the Commission has approved the go ahead with projects. It never on any project -- and I know this probably better than most -- that the role of the Commission traditionally never has been to go to start studying a project to delay it or whatever, it's been once we get to the project that needs to be approved that is the point in the past where the Commission has come in. Now we did on this one to write those letters because it was a big project and I think I attempted to explain last time, we met with the staff and because we knew it was a controversial explosive thing to announce it at one time where everybody had it equally and not saying, I'm sure we had some people that were not on the Commission were concerned that they were not notified. As a matter of fact he has let me know that he would not notify persons. I think everybody wanted to be notified first and we kind of anticipated that, so we made the decision and sent all the letters out at one time and I guess that way we got a little heat from everybody but not a great deal from one that was left last.

Commissioner Rhodes:

Are you saying Joe that it's your view that the Commission can start a project, recommend a project, with your recommendation and approval but then you have the right as Executive Director and your staff to cancel that project without the Commission knowing it?

Mr. Rideoutte:

I would say that if the Commission approved that project we definitely ought to go back to them. What I'm saying a normal thing in the past has been if we started making up plans and all just like we did on that, I don't remember the Commission ever really approving that thing as such. It was just sort of put on hold and never really counseled or anything. I think any action you've got -- I think the proper thing there for the Commission to take formal action would have been when we adopted the project and said "Okay, we're going to go with it", let a contract and go ahead and do things like that. I don't think the Commission has ever been in on the earlier parts.

Commissioner Mack:

We didn't fund it?

Commissioner Rhodes:

Are you saying the Commission never did agree with the project?

Mr. Rideoutte:

I don't think there's such. In fact I don't think the Commission ever told the Highway Department - Go Ahead with that section of the project, go ahead and do it now.

Commissioner Rhodes:

Wasn't it common knowledge that that's what the Highway Department's going to do?

Mr. Rideoutte:

Well no I don't think it was ever common knowledge on that. I think it started off as a study by the Federal Government a number of years ago that they recommended that we do those three projects. Now we took one of them, the only one in the SHIMS program is the one that's still active and we're going to do that one from Conway to Myrtle Beach. The only thing I know in the other one is the southern leg. The commission has never given us instructions on that southern leg or the third leg which was supposed to be the leg that we put on hold. It was an attempt in there to bring these two project together as one and that's what I guess we put on hold.

Commissioner Mack:

Let me ask a question Joe. When we approve the SHIMS program the Commission is in essence approving that project is it not?

Mr. Rideoutte:

The only project in the SHIMS program is that one leg.

Commissioner Mack:

I understand that, it's just the Conway to Myrtle Beach leg.

Commissioner Rhodes:

Well the Commission doesn't even approve the SHIMS program necessarily.

Commissioner Mack:

Yes we do.

Commissioner Truluck:

Well I think it's the magnitude of the project and the it was a number one -- you know -- on every list it was number one priority to get done. And the size of the project. It's number one on the SHIMS.

Mr. Rideoutte:

Not that section. That section was the third section. It's not in the SHIMS program at all. Only that one leg is on the SHIMS program.

Commissioner Truluck:

Well I just think that the magnitude of the project that the people involved. People call us, ya'll get calls but we get calls too. And, for example, Linwood here, he Chairs the Grand Strand -- Ex chairman. But anyway he said he'd worked on it a long time and he didn't know anything about it until he read it in the paper and I think that's the kind of thing that we're talking about.

Commissioner Crow:

Well Mr. Chairman all I'd like to do is note in the Minutes, if it takes a motion to change the Minutes.

Commissioner Mack:

I was going to say without except -- if there's no objection by the Commission, I would like to see the reflect you comments, all of your comments about your concerns about that and I don't see any problem with that. Do you see any problem with that Mr. Secretary.

Commissioner Crow:

And if you traced it you would see considerable highway funds were spent conducting those studies, environmental, etc. I don't want anybody to tell me because I might be able to go through the rest of the meeting.

Mr. Snyder:

If I could let me just make one comment and maybe this project is, and what I was getting ready to say is traditionally what we have done. Maybe this project is not traditional Mr. Truluck because of the magnitude but under normal circumstances the Commission approves a project for preliminary engineering. Set aside the "C" program because you make all the decisions on the "C" program basically. But on the federal programs and even

Mr. Snyder:

extending that into the SHIMS program, once we go through preliminary engineering, if we determine a project is not feasible, traditionally we have never come back the Commission and said "Do ya'll agree with us that we're going to drop it"? Traditionally the staff has made those type decisions and it's at different levels depending on the magnitude of the project. This was a major project so Bob and I discussed it and then we discussed it with Mr. Rideoutte and made a decision to not advance the project any further at this time. That doesn't mean that the project can never be re-resurrected because it can, but what I'm trying to say is traditionally and maybe we need a little more direction in that area but we have never really come back to the Commission after we have made studies and determine that project was not feasible for whatever reason.

Commissioner McKnight:

Mr. Snyder I think what we were saying basically is not bring it back to the Commission but just give us a notification.

Commissioner Altman:

We need knowledge of it so that when people call we would be intelligent enough to respond to them in some way.

Mr. Rideoutte:

Wallace did you and Linwood not get letters on that.

Commissioner Altman:

I didn't get one.

Commissioner McKnight:

I got my letter a few days afterward.

Commissioner Crow: I never got one.

Commissioner Rhodes:

I think the full Commission should get a letter.

Commissioner Mack:

I was going to say I remember getting a letter.

Commissioner McKnight:

I got it a few days afterward. It was in the newspaper before I got the letter. I had a serious problem with my mail

Commissioner McKnight:

here recently. It would go to Abbeville and then it would find it's way back to me.

Mr. Rideoutte:

We really mailed the letters and then sent something to the news media a few days later.

Commissioner Truluck:

I got -- you know -- in your defense, I got a letter but it was a copy of a letter written to somebody else and apparently it was mailed at the same time.

Commissioner Mack:

Well I think if we take care of putting in the Minutes, I think that's at least -- the comments at this meeting will go in the Minutes.

Commissioner Crow:

Very well. That's all I ask.

Commissioner Mack:

If there's no objection by the Commission.

Commissioner Crow:

As amended, I move the approval.

Commissioner McKnight: Second

Commissioner Mack:
