Dear Mr. Clements,

On October 1, 2012, our office received your request for additional documents relating to your original request of August 22, 2012 for:

All public records, including reports, documents, orders, emails, and phone records written by Governor Haley and staff, or in their possession, related to internal communication, including with other agencies of the Government of the State of South Carolina, or communication with the U.S. Department of Energy, including the Savannah River Site, concerning the receipt and storage of highly radioactive spent fuel at the Savannah River Site for "consolidated storage".

All documents related to your original request have been sent. Some additional documents related to your new request have been located as detailed below:

1. "...[D]ocuments...in the possession of Josh Baker, including a draft document sent to Karen Patterson, chair of the Governor's Nuclear Advisory Council, which was mentioned in the April 4, 2012 email...provided." This document, which relates generally to your original request, is a working document that was deemed not for distribution by the sender. Our office came into possession of this document as the recipient and has exempted the document from disclosure as allowed pursuant to South Carolina Code 30-4-40(a)(2). However, as soon as this document is deemed finalized for distribution and should our office be in possession of the finalized document, then it can be provided to you.
2. "...[A] copy of any 'position on interim storage' developed by Governor Haley's office. There is no record responsive to this request.


