

Dear Governor Haley,

My name is Roslin J. Fields, and I am the Executive Director/Founder of Youth Empowerment Services, Inc. (Y.E.S.) a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization. I taught in the public middle schools in the low country for 28 years, and then took an early retirement to serve full time as the Executive Director of Y.E.S. I am also a former Foster Parent who is proud to say that I adopted one of my foster children who is now a successful adult.

I founded Y.E.S. in 1999 because I know first-hand the challenges youth face in South Carolina and today's society. The mission of Y.E.S. is to empower girls through Christian principles to discover, embrace and appreciate their self-worth leading to a healthy and productive lifestyle. Since our inception, Y.E.S. has served over 5,000 youth, parents, and community leaders throughout South Carolina and beyond through our mentoring programs, college prep activities, and community events aimed at empowering youth to form healthy relationships and become productive citizens.

In 2014 and 2015, Y.E.S. sponsored the Dream Girls Conference with over 1,200 girls in attendance both years. Attendees came from 60 counties across South Carolina as well as other states. Y.E.S. began sponsoring this conference in response to requests from communities across our state for empowerment programs that are specifically designed for at-risk girls. The Dream Girls Conference is empowering teenage girls, before they become adults, with hope and vision to avoid and overcome problems that are too common in Urban and Rural areas of South Carolina such as, sexual and physical abuse, low self-esteem, fatherlessness, premature deaths, hopelessness, out-of-wedlock pregnancies, STD's, poverty and lack of education.

Comments and evaluations reveal that South Carolina residents had been waiting for this type of event for girls for years. This conference is unique to South Carolina due to its impact and the straight-forward message of empowerment for girls. For example, a parent commented that she is so glad that this conference is offered and that she was waiting for an event like this for her daughter since she moved to the Charleston area from the Northern United States, where these types of events are always available. She was glad that she does not have to travel far anymore to find a quality conference for her daughter to attend.


