Credit Card Cos. Lose \$42M NJ Tax Challenge

Credit card interest and other fees charged via New Jersey cardholders properly belong in the Garden State, according to a state tax court decision published on Tuesday rejecting a challenge to \$42 million in taxes from Bank of America and several related credit card companies.

Both new drug application holders and follow-on applicants should review the new provisions carefully, as failure to comply could have substantial consequences, say attorneys at Latham & Watkins LLP.

DOE Rule Simplifies Interstate Power Transmission Siting

A Change In Course For The Treatment Of Broadband Data
