WHEREAS, Taiwan has contributed to the growth of international community through its participation in multilateral trade associations and international humanitarian relief organizations; and

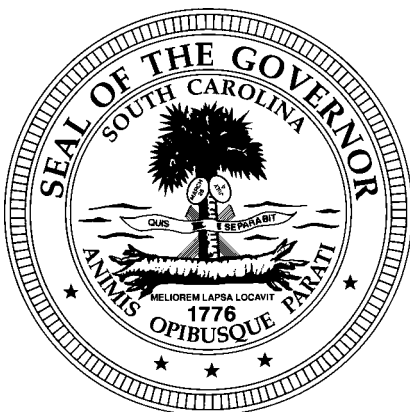
WHEREAS, the State of South Carolina and Taiwan have enjoyed friendly and fruitful sister-state relations for many years; and
