Looks good. Number seven is accurate, but we should probably add language that describes how the voluntary agencies set a projected number each year. If they exceed the number by greater than 10% the state is notified. In other words, while the state can't control the number that are settled here they have a pretty good idea of projected new refugee arrivals each year (with the exception of refugees that voluntarily relocate from other states). Right?
