

At the South Carolina state meeting it was brought up how Oral Surgeons aren't reimbursed for medicaid patients for medical procedures like fractures and incision and drainages yet our medical colleagues are. After some discussion DHHS agreed to our argument and, from my understanding, decided that no provider with any degree would be paid on these procedures. As someone who on a weekly basis has to see these patients I am disturbed by this development. Essentially the plan for the indigent in this state over the age of 21 if for these patients to go to the hospital, have these patients referred to a local Oral Surgeon who is kind enough to remain on staff at a hospital then treat these patients for free; sure we can bill them but everyone knows we will never see a penny. In addition we have to take on all of the liability that comes from treating these difficult patients knowing that we will never see any financial benefit.

Over the last two weeks I've had to hospitalize two patients for ID&Ds, one for a fracture and have an ameloblastoma arrive in my office, all with medicaid, all who I have to treat and know I won't collect a penny. While reimbursement isn't the primary concern of my practice it is certainly a concern, and from what I've seen from both agencies - DHHS and Dentaquest - the concerns of Oral Surgeons in the state are at the bottom of the list for both of you. No group has taken a bigger hit then we have and now we have to deal with the insult of you telling us emergency procedures on the poor of the state aren't your concern, they are my concern. I guess the plan is to push us as far as you can until we all have to drop off staff at the local hospitals then our concerns might actually seem real, but I can promise you are pushing this Oral Surgeon, and many of my colleagues, too far.

As such, I cannot in good conscience remain on peer review to help organizations that view the concerns of my fellow surgeons and I as being trivial. I will not take a day out of my office to drive to Columbia and donate my time to help you continue to push the Dentists who treat the needy of the state into a situation where they cannot help them unless you declare yourself a charity. I resign from the peer review committee and wish you luck finding someone from our state to take my place.
