THE GOP ANTI-WOMAN AGENDA

In an attempt to pretend that they learned their lesson in 2012, Republican candidates in 2014 knew better than to run on their deeply unpopular anti-woman positions and instead borrowed rhetoric from Democrats — including claiming to support equal pay for equal work, access to birth control, and paid sick leave. In some cases, they even ran against their own records. But in the end, after all the ballots were counted and the GOP took office, they went right back to governing as though they were following a playbook from the 1950s — and showed their true colors.

Only one week into the new session, the Republican majority in Congress introduced five anti-choice bills and announced that they had scheduled a vote for an abortion ban to coincide with the January 22nd anniversary of the *Roe v. Wade* decision. When that bill — which included mandatory police reporting in order to receive an abortion after rape — proved too extreme for even some of their own members, the GOP dropped it in an embarrassing late-night capitulation. But of course they were right back at it the next day and passed another dangerous anti-woman bill instead.

The Republicans' true priority is clear and remains unchanged: they want to roll back the clock on women's rights. They are trying to bar Title X funds to groups including Planned Parenthood. Defunding Planned Parenthood puts the health of millions of women in jeopardy — including women who visit these clinics for breast exams and cancer screenings. The GOP insists on introducing legislation that would make it more difficult for women to access necessary health care, including legislation that has already failed in Congress in the past.

The 2016 presidential Republican hopefuls are in lockstep with their party, from Mike Huckabee saying women who swear are trashy and Beyoncé is a danger to our daughters to Lindsey Graham asking a conservative audience to help him solve the "definitional problem of rape." The Republican agenda is so extreme that GOP has come to stand for "Genuinely Outrageous Priorities." But thanks to EMILY's List members, our pro-choice Democratic women will hold them accountable through Election Day!
