## **In Six States, 1 in 10 Households Doesn't Have a Bank Account**

According to an annual survey by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, 7 percent of U.S. households were "unbanked" in 2015, which means that no one in the household had a checking or savings account. That's around 9 million households consisting of 15.6 million adults and 7.6 million children. The percentage of the population that is unbanked varies considerably across states, ranging from a low of less than 2 percent in New Hampshire and Vermont to more than 10 percent in Alabama, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma and Tennessee. Louisiana has the highest rate at 14 percent.
