### **The Growing Economy**

Real gross domestic product for the United States grew 1.8 percent in 2013, slower than the 2.5 percent growth in 2012. Three industries—nondurable goods manufacturing, real estate and rental and leasing, and agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting—contributed about 42 percent to the real GDP growth rate.

### **The War on Unemployment**

### Meet Our President: Nevada Gov. Brian Sandoval

Superlatives are nothing new in the long public service career of CSG's 2015 National President and Nevada Gov. Brian Sandoval. He was the first Hispanic to hold state office in Nevada when he was elected attorney general in 2002. He became the state's first Hispanic federal judge when he was appointed by President George W. Bush as U.S. district judge for the District of Nevada in 2005. And Sandoval was the first challenger to ever beat a sitting governor in a primary election, defeating then-Gov. Jim Gibbons in 2010.
