Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, neurofibromatosis (NF) is a set of genetic disorders that cause tumors to grow along various types of nerves and can affect the development of non-nervous tissues such as bone and skin; and

WHEREAS, affecting approximately 100,000 Americans, there are three distinct types of neurofibromatosis with symptoms generally appearing during childhood and early adolescence and giving rise to various conditions including changes in the appearance of the skin, bone deformities, hearing loss, ringing in the ears, poor balance and intense pain; and

WHEREAS, the 2011 observance of Neurofibromatosis Awareness Month helps call attention to this disorder and those whose lives it affects.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 2011 as

NEUROFIBROMATOSIS AWARENESS MONTH

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to learn more about neurofibromatosis and to work together to raise awareness of this devastating disorder.
