Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome (EDS) is a group of inherited disorders of the connective tissues that primarily affect the skin, joints, ligaments and blood vessel walls; and

WHEREAS, people with Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome experience symptoms including stretchy or fragile skin, flexible joints that extend beyond the normal range of motion, muscle weakness, heart problems; muscle weakness, abnormal wound healing and a family history of ruptured organs; and

WHEREAS, EDS is a serious and life threatening condition that has no treatment or cure; and

WHEREAS, thousands of residents of the Palmetto State, including patients, friends family, caregivers, medical professionals, social workers, and researchers seeking to develop safe, effective treatments, are impacted by Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 2011 as

EHLERS-DANLOS SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to raise awareness of Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome and of the need for research to help ensure accurate diagnoses and appropriate treatment for those it affects.
