The Governor's Office was involved in the first 2012 negotiation with Mt. Holly (when co-owned by Alcoa/Century) and Santee Cooper to provide fair and reasonable terms to ensure that the plant could continue to operate. With the recent 2015 negotiations, Secretary Hitt, at the direction of the Governor and the request of Century Aluminum, served as an informal mediator over several weeks to reach another fair and reasonable agreement. At this time, we understand that the parties have reached an impasse. The Governor has been supportive of Mt. Holly and has been aware of recent ongoing negotiations mediated by Sec. Hitt.

I'm working on a follow-up to Century Aluminum's announcement last week that it will close its Mount Holly plant if an agreement can't be reached with Santee Cooper by the end of this year on supplying power to the plant. Has the governor's office had any contact – or does Gov. Haley have any plans to intervene – with Century Aluminum and/or Santee Cooper in an attempt to resolve the impasse between those parties? Is there anything the governor's office can do incentive-wise or financially to either offset the electric costs Century Aluminum says it can no longer afford or compensate Santee Cooper for the revenue it claims it would lose under Century Aluminum's proposal?
