



Other adults – coaches, teachers, church leaders, scoutmasters – come up to me and tell me things they have noticed about him or seen him do that just make me so proud. These comments are unsolicited and from people who have nothing to gain from telling them to me.

For instance, one of the scoutmasters of Troop 266 was with Thomas recently at Winter Camp at Kiawah. Afterwards, he came up to me and told me what a joy it was to have Thomas there, because as an Assistant Junior Scoutmaster, he sets such a good example, has a great attitude, helps the younger scouts, and exemplifies Scouting values. Another leader, separately, remarked to me how impressed he was with Thomas's dedication to his running – getting up very early every morning in order to not let his daily practice runs slip. Thomas would pass these guys on their way to breakfast a couple times. Another scoutmaster had fun with Thomas because he knows what a straight arrow he is when it comes to wearing his uniform the right way. Because it was like 70 degrees that week and the mosquitoes were out, he told the troop that they did not have to wear their neckerchiefs to dinner. They knew this would be a very hard pill for Thomas to swallow, but Thomas complied. After about two nights, the scoutmaster knew that this was hard for Thomas, so he told the troop to wear their neckerchiefs, as they should have! The men had a great time telling me about this later and ribbing Thomas about it.

Thomas is a member of Woodruff Road Presbyterian Church, has a 4.3 GPA, and was All-State in Cross Country this year for Eastside High School. He always has a great attitude, encourages others, works hard, is self-motivated, does things without our asking, and reads his Bible and prays.
