Our office has identified two additional records responsive to your Freedom of Information Act request for the following:

“Communications between the office of Governor Nikki Haley and that of the office of Georgia Governor Nathan Deal as well as communications between Governor Haley’s office and the Georgia Department of Emergency Management from October 2nd, 2016 through October 9th, 2016 regards to evacuations, preparations and co-ordination of efforts and/or resources surrounding the approach, arrival and subsequent effects of Hurricane Matthew.”

As previously stated: Our office has identified records responsive to your request and will provide any and all records in our possession that are responsive to your request, subject to any exemptions or redactions as allowed pursuant to Section 30-4-40(a) of the South Carolina Code of Laws or as is otherwise exempt from disclosure by statute or regulation or prohibited from disclosure by court order.

Enclosed are records responsive to your request, which are the only records identified as being responsive to your request at this time. In addition, be advised that, due to the low volume of records identified, our office has waived costs associated with the production as is allowed pursuant to Section 30-4-30(b).
