As I read the Wikipedia articles I wrote an X indicating where in my maximally analytical research method each Republican Leader's biography place them. Some of my previous favorites fell as I knew more about them. Other people who I previously didn't know much about assumed the most favorable status. Now I can state with certainty that Susana Martinez (New Mexico Governor) has been analyzed as having the highest analyzed recommendation for President with 4.6, followed by Nikki Haley (South Carolina Governor) and John Thune (South Dakota Senator) each with 4.4.
