Mr. Joey Wright was in Court in Pickens County and was unable to attend.

Mr. Poore called the meeting to order and Councilman Curtis Kinley gave the invocation.

Mr. Bill Gaston, Chairman of the Election Commission, asked Council for approval of \$7,770 in additional funds to conduct the November 10th special election. On the motion of Mr. Kinley, seconded by Mr. Rhodes, Council voted unanimously to transfer the funds from Account #910 - Contingency Fund (\$7770.00) needed by the Election Commission.

Mr. Gaston also recommended to Council to sell the 57 voting machines and change over to the Vote Recorder. He asked Council to determine the County Council District lines as soon as possible and to consider hiring an Administrator for the Board of Elections on July 1, 1982. Council received Mr. Gaston's remarks as information.

Mr. Mike Mullinax, representing Starr-Iva Water & Sewer District, asked Council for reimbursement for water used from Jan. 1, 1980 thru Dec. 31, 1980 in the amount of \$600.00. Council received as information.

Mr. L.H. Senn, III asked Council to endorse two grants thru ARC for construction of a sewer line on Highway US 76. On the motion of Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Kinley, Council voted unanimously to endorse the grants. (Resolution #129)

Mr. Wilton Mackey asked Council to transfer funds for a seminar from one account to another. On the motion of Mr. Kinley, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted unanimously to transfer the needed funds.

Mr. Charles Murdock asked Council to transfer \$250 needed for the purchase of a hycl counter that was included in the budget from one account to another. On the motion of Mr. Bratcher, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted unanimously to allow the transfer.

Mr. David Watson explained the need to reimburse Judge Cox for \$125.00 from the Bar Association. On the motion of Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Kinley, Council voted unanimously to take the money from the Law Library to pay the bill.

Mr. Hooper presented third and final reading of Ordinance #70 (Mentally Retarded &

Developmentally Disabled). On the motion of Mr. Bratcher, seconded by Mr. Kinley, Council voted unanimously to adopt on third reading.

Mr. Rhodes presented third and final reading of Ordinance #69 (Rules & Regulations of Purchases). On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted 3 in favor and 1 abstaining. Mr. Bratcher abstained.

Mr. Lionel Chapman, Chairman of the Democratic Party, spoke briefly regarding the Election Commission's request. He stated that County Council should give careful consideration prior to any action on the request concerning changing from the voting machines to vote recorder. He also stated that he would be glad to serve on any study committee if such was designed by County Council.

Council discussed briefly the redistricting of County Council district lines. On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Kinley, Council voted unanimously to direct Mr. Trey Senn to work on the district lines and report back.

On the motion of Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Kinley, Council voted unanimously to adjourn at 10:15 a.m.
