SCDOT is further identifying transit agencies and locations that exhibit underutilization of transit vehicles, and following a protocol to transfer identified vehicles to locations where they would be fully utilized rather than investing in new vehicle acquisition. Both practices contribute to cost savings and maximum utilization of funding resources while properly maintaining the state's public transit vehicles.</u>
