This fierce looking fish is a cutlassfish (Trichiurus lepturus). They are commonly caught off fishing piers. They have also been spotted off the jetty at Huntington Beach State Park jumping out of the water chasing prey! These silvery and skinny fish can grow up to 4 feet long. They are notorious bait stealers- they can easily cut fishing rigs with their sharp teeth. Be careful if you catch one!
