Painted Buntings, anyone? Male painted buntings, considered by many to be the most colorful songbird in North America, have finally arrived at Huntington Beach State Park! The birds showed up at the Nature Center feeders on April 18, 11 days later than they made their appearance last year. A total of 3 males were seen. Many of the buntings at the park are now banded, and researchers encourage everyone to get involved in this citizen scientist project.
