BACKGROUND: In 2014, SC DMV and Donate Life SC announced a partnership to increase the number of registrants on the Organ and Tissue Donor Registry by 40%. **The actual increase was 31%, but Col. Shwedo is set to announce the figure during the press conference.**

April will be designated as Donate Life Month in SC by a Senate resolution.

Jane Davis is the mother of a 6 year old girl, Natalie, who received a heart transplant.

Ed Billings is the father of Thad Billings. Thad was killed in a car accident on Memorial Day 1994. His heart, kidneys, liver, pancreas and corneas were recovered for transplants and 5 people's lives were saved and 2 more were benefited from improved vision.

Brad Dean is the President and CEO of Myrtle Beach area Chamber of Commerce and a living kidney donor.

- I am proud to be here today supporting such a worthy cause.
- I'd like to thank Senator Shealy, Col. Shwedo of the DMV and Tracy Armstrong of Donate Life SC for their leadership on this issue.
- April, as you know, is Donate Life Month and an opportunity to raise awareness of organ and tissue donation in SC.
- Simply put, organ donation can save lives and improve the quality of other lives.

- Jane Davis is here with us. Her daughter, Natalie, is a 6 year old who received a heart transplant.
- Ed Billings is the father of Thad Billings – an organ donor whose tragic death nonetheless helped 7 people.
- Brad Dean, the President and CEO of the Myrtle Beach area Chamber of Commerce, is a living kidney donor.
- These are the faces of organ donation in South Carolina.
- Every 10 minutes, another person is added to the national transplant waiting list.
- Approximately 1,000 South Carolinians currently need an organ transplant.
- DMV is often the first step in the organ donation process – more than 98% of the South Carolinians on the organ donation registry signed up at the DMV.
- Last year, the DMV and Donate Life SC partnered on a statewide campaign to increase the number of people on the organ donor registry. The results show last year's campaign has helped raise awareness to the need for more organ, eye and tissue donors in South Carolina.
- Because this is such a critical issue, I'm excited by the renewed campaign partnership between SC DMV and Donate Life SC.
- It is my hope that through our efforts, we can raise continue to raise awareness and increase the number of people on the registry.
- Thanks again for all of your hard work. Together, we can continue to raise awareness of organ and tissue donation.

WHAT: Press Conference conducted by Donate Life South Carolina (DLSC) and the South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles (SCDMV) on the first floor lobby of the State House at 10:00 a.m., Thursday, April 2, 2015. An update will be given on the renewed partnership and statewide campaign that was launched in 2014 to increase the number of registrants on the S.C. Organ and Tissue Donor Registry. The goal was to obtain a *donor designation rate* of 40% by the end of 2014. The *donor designation rate* is the rate at which individuals join the state's donor registry as a percentage of all I.D./driving credentials issued during the same time period at the SCDMV offices. April will also be designated as **Donate Life Month** in South Carolina by a Senate Resolution.

This event will also honor donor families and celebrate the gift of life through donation, as well as provide the opportunity to learn more about lifesaving organ/tissue donation. Guests will be given the opportunity to sign up on the South Carolina Donor Registry.

WHO: Governor Nikki Haley will speak in support of this collaborative effort, followed by **Senator Katrina Shealy** of Lexington County who will announce the **Donate Life Month** Resolution. **South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles** Executive Director Kevin A. Shwedo and Donate Life SC CEO Tracy Armstrong will then announce the results of the renewed partnership between the two organizations. Other speakers will include: Ed Billings (donor family member), Jane Davis (mother of a child heart recipient) and Brad Dean(living kidney donor). Also featured on the program will be Lanie

Hudson, the reigning Miss South Carolina. They will all speak briefly about their connection to donation and the importance of registering more organ, eye and tissue donors.

WHY: More than 98% of the people who are in the registry signed up through the SCDMV. Still, the number of people in need of transplants continues to rise. Results from the first year of this collaboration will show that it has helped call attention to the need for more organ, eye and tissue donors in South Carolina and has informed the public about the S.

C. Organ and Tissue Donor Registry. **Every 10 minutes** another person is added to the national transplant waiting list; approximately 1,000 people in South Carolina currently need an organ transplant. Many will die unless more people become donors.
