1 TOMMY DUNN: At this time I'd like to
2 call to order the December 1st part of the presentation
3 meeting to order. And at this time I'd like to let the
4 record show that Mr. Waters is running late. He's not
5 here. And Ms. Floyd's running late. She's not here.
6 And we'll start off with Resolution #2(a) a
7 proclamation proclaiming Arbor Day Month. Mr. Mitchell
8 Cole. Councilman Cole.
9 MITCHELL COLE: Mr. Chairman, Council,
10 Proclamation today,
11 Whereas, in 1872 J. Sterling Morton proposed
12 to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day
13 be set aside for the planting of trees, and
14 Whereas, the holiday, called Arbor Day, was
15 first observed with the planting of more than a million
16 trees in Nebraska, and
17 Whereas, Arbor Day is now observed throughout
18 the nation and the world, and
19 Whereas, trees can reduce the erosion of our
20 precious topsoil by wind and water, lower our heating
21 and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the
22 air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife,
23 and
24 Whereas, trees are a renewable resource giving
25 us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and
26 countless other wood products, and
27 Whereas, trees increase local property values,
28 enhance the economic vitality of business area, and
29 beautify our community, and
30 Whereas, trees, whenever they are planted, are
31 a source of joy and spiritual renewal,
32 Whereas, Anderson County values having trees
33 in our community so much that it has earned and
34 maintained the Tree City USA designation since 2003.
35 NOW THEREFORE, we the Anderson County Council
36 of Anderson, South Carolina, do hereby proclaim
37 December 2015 as ARBOR DAY MONTH in the County of
38 Anderson, South Carolina, and we urge all citizens to
39 celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect
40 our trees and woodlands and
41 Further, we urge all citizens to plant and
42 care for trees to gladden the heart and promote the
43 well-being of this and future generations.
44 Proclaimed on this 1st day of December in the
45 year 2015.
46 And I put this forward as a motion. Thank
47 you.
48 TOMMY DUNN: Have a motion, second Ms.
49 Wilson. Any further discussion? Hearing none, all in
50 favor of the motion show of hands. All opposed like

1 sign. Show the motion carries unanimously. Anything
2 else, Mr. Cole? Thank you, sir.

3 Moving on to Item number 2(b) Proclamation
4 PROCLAIMING DECEMBER 2015 SMALL BUSINESS MONTH. Mr.
5 Crowder. And I believe he's got some small business
6 people here tonight.

7 FRANCIS CROWDER: Yes, thank you so much,
8 Chairman. You know, it gives me great pleasure to
9 recognize the small business of our Anderson County
10 because you are the foundation of Anderson County.
11 It's a statistic that small businesses drive the most
12 jobs of any sector of our economy. And so, having come
13 from a small business where I worked in a five and ten
14 many, many, many, many, many years ago, and enjoyed
15 that and had the opportunity to know everybody that
16 came and went and it was a lot -- that was a lot of
17 people in that small town. Well, not a lot, by your
18 standards. I've always tried my best to shop local and
19 shop small business.

20 And so, American Express started a trend
21 several years ago, you will remember, where they set
22 aside the Saturday after Black Friday, or whatever you
23 want to call it, as Small Business event day. And I
24 thought it would be very appropriate for Anderson
25 County Council to recognize our small businesses
26 throughout the county because you are the engine of the
27 county. Again, statistics prove that three times more
28 money -- well, two point five, thereabouts -- stay in
29 the community than if you shop otherwise. And then,
30 obviously, if people shop online none of it stays in
31 the community.

32 And so, tonight, it gives me great pleasure to
33 enter this proclamation about small business week. But
34 also to honor the businesses that we've invited tonight
35 for their contribution in the economy of Anderson
36 County. And you represent not only the retail, but the
37 service sector of our economy and you range everywhere
38 from people who have been here a long time and people
39 entrenched in the community to those who have just
40 ventured out and you are the entrepreneur trying to
41 plow new ground and be creative, and that's what
42 America's all about. So after that, I will read the
43 following.

44 Whereas, there are over 28,000,000 small
45 businesses in the United States including the 13,212
46 small businesses located in Anderson County; and

47 Whereas, locally-owned independent businesses
48 generate thousands of jobs for Anderson County
49 residents each year and provide unique services and
50 products that give Anderson County its distinct

1 character and sense of pride; and

2 Whereas, Anderson County's independently-owned
3 businesses give back to our communities in goods,
4 services, time, talent and help preserve the uniqueness
5 of our communities; and

6 Whereas the health of Anderson County's
7 economy and that of each community within it, depends
8 on our support of businesses owned by our friends and
9 neighbors; and

10 Therefore, we join the residents of Anderson
11 County in celebrating Small Business Month across the
12 county by taking the pledge to support local and
13 independent businesses and

14 In grateful recognition thereof, we do hereby
15 declare December 2015 to be "SMALL BUSINESS MONTH" and
16 encourage consumers to shop locally during this holiday
17 season in support of our locally owned businesses and
18 to ensure our local economy continues to prosper
19 throughout the New Year.

20 Put that in the form of a motion, Chairman.

21 TOMMY DUNN: Have a motion. Have a
22 second? Second, Mr. Waters. Any further discussion?
23 Hearing none, all in favor of the motion show of hands.
24 All opposed like sign. Show the motion carries
25 unanimously.

26 FRANCIS CROWDER: May I make one additional
27 comment before we ask our distinguished guests to come
28 forward so that we can present them with a plaque. We
29 will be running some ads both in the newspapers and on
30 our -- the radio stations so that you won't feel like
31 that all we do is sit up here and read a declaration
32 and don't show that we're involved. So, this is a part
33 of economic development. You are part of the economic
34 development, because you're here and we appreciate you.
35 And I'd like to read the names into the record of those
36 who we've selected -- obviously, there are thirteen
37 thousand of you out in our county and we would have
38 loved to invite thirteen thousand people here tonight.
39 But we have Blake and Brady's Boutique; we have
40 Sullivan's Metropolitan Grill; we have Pazza
41 Consignment Shop and Boutique; we have Grady's Great
42 Outdoors; we have Direct Access. And then we have one
43 of my favorite eating places, in fact, we've got both
44 of them side by -- almost side by side -- Mama Penn's.
45 And so at this time if you would come to the front and
46 if my fellow Council members would join me in my making
47 these plaque presentations.

1 TOMMY DUNN: At this time I'd like to
2 call the December 1st regular Anderson County Council
3 meeting to order. Welcome everyone here. At this time
4 I'd like to ask Councilman Ken Waters, vice-chairman,
5 if he'd lead us in the Invocation and Pledge of
6 Allegiance. If we'd all rise, please.

7 **(INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE BY KEN WATERS)**

8 TOMMY DUNN: Before we get started, going
9 down -- I'll ask approval of the minutes of the
10 November 17th, 2015 regular Council meeting. Are there
11 any corrections to be made? Mr. Crowder? Make sure
12 you're on, Mr. Crowder. Make sure you're getting
13 picked up good.

14 FRANCIS CROWDER: There we go. Thank you,
15 sir. On page 12, let me get, page 12, line 22, change
16 the word yep to yes. Page 45 line 1, change Rose Hall
17 to Ruby Hall. Okay? I had the wrong name of what they
18 were going to renovate. On page 47, line 17, there
19 were two blank spaces in the minutes that looked like
20 it was something missing, but they were actually
21 pauses, and there were no lost words. Page 50 line 11
22 we need the word -- add the word account, a-c-c-o-u-n-
23 t. Thank you, Chairman.

24 TOMMY DUNN: Mr. Crowder makes the motion
25 make those corrections in the minutes. Do we have a
26 second?

27 TOM ALLEN: Second.

28 TOMMY DUNN: Second Mr. Allen. Any
29 further discussion? Then all in favor of the motion
30 show of hands. All opposed like sign. Show the motion
31 carries unanimously. At this time for Citizens
32 Comments, I'll ask Mr. Harmon if he's got his --
33 introduce his colleagues here with us tonight. I know
34 we all met them before, but good to put it on the
35 record.

36 LEON HARMON: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
37 I'd like to introduce to Council, James Galyean. James
38 is a member in our Greenville office and sometimes
39 fills in when I am unavailable.

40 TOMMY DUNN: Appreciate it. Welcome
41 here.

42 LEON HARMON: And Mr. Burns just reminded
43 me, he, like I, am -- is a resident of Anderson County.

44 TOMMY DUNN: Great to have him.
45 Now we'll be moving on to Citizens Comments.

46 LEON HARMON: Mr. Chairman, there are no
47 citizens signed up to speak.

48 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Harmon.
49 Appreciate it.

50 Moving on to Item number 5, Request for 800MHZ

1 radios for the city of Pendleton, Mr. Allen. Mr.
2 Allen.

3 TOM ALLEN: Yes, Mr. Chair, the city of
4 Pendleton has asked if we could assist them with their
5 800 radio system. Initially they asked for eight
6 radios and we have asked them if they would be kind
7 enough to knock that down to two radios, which they
8 have done. And what we'll be doing is just picking up
9 the initial cost, the subscription for that, for those
10 two radios, which we have done for numerous other
11 cities in the county. So I'll put that in the form of
12 a motion.

13 TOMMY DUNN: Have a motion Mr. Allen.
14 Have a second?

15 KEN WATERS: Second.

16 TOMMY DUNN: Second Mr. Waters. Any
17 discussion? All in favor of the motion show of hands.
18 All opposed like sign. Show the motion carries
19 unanimously. Anything else, Mr. Allen?

20 TOM ALLEN: That's all.

21 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you.

22 Moving on to Item number 6, the ATAX
23 recommendations. I'd like to throw out on the floor to
24 get the discussion started, I'd like to make a motion
25 that we approve the staff's accommodation tax
26 recommendation, with the following modifications.
27 Decrease the Anderson County Museum new roof from fifty
28 thousand dollars to zero. And that does not mean they
29 won't get a roof. We've got money in the budget to get
30 the roof on the museum. Increase the Mill Town Players
31 from zero to three thousand. Increase the Honea Path
32 Merchant Sugar Foot Festival from one thousand to three
33 thousand. Increase the Fishers of Men, South Carolina
34 Upstate Legacy Series of Lake Hartwell Tournament two
35 from three hundred dollars to two thousand. And I
36 would -- that would leave a remainder of forty-two
37 thousand three hundred dollars remaining balance to be
38 held in escrow and hopefully we can put a sign up,
39 check about putting a sign up for the airport. We've
40 got to look about that. And it's perfectly thing about
41 doing another allotment around it something another.
42 We're not losing the money. Money will be there. And
43 I put that in the form of a motion.

44 FRANCIS CROWDER: I'll second.

45 TOMMY DUNN: Second Mr. Crowder. Now,
46 any discussion?

47 CINDY WILSON: Mr. Chairman?

48 TOMMY DUNN: Ms. Floyd asked first.

49 GRACIE FLOYD: ???

50 AUDIENCE: Can't hear you, ma'am.

1 GRACIE FLOYD: I'm trying to get it on,
2 now, please. Mr. Chairman, I have been out, as you
3 know, for I think -- I might have missed two in total
4 meetings. But did we go through these?
5 TOMMY DUNN: No, they was brought up at,
6 I think, at -- two or three meetings ago for
7 information only and for everybody to go back and make
8 recommendations and stuff and it was put on the agenda
9 to go back through here tonight. And that's what I'm
10 doing.
11 GRACIE FLOYD: Okay. I might have been out
12 when we went through that, when that was said, because
13 I don't remember going through these. But I went
14 through them, but not -- okay. Thank you.
15 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you. Ms. Wilson?
16 CINDY WILSON: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. As
17 you know, I'm on the board of Upstate Equine Council
18 and volunteer ---
19 TOMMY DUNN: I was going to ask about
20 that.
21 CINDY WILSON: --- and I need to recuse
22 from that section. And I would request that we
23 separate that one.
24 TOMMY DUNN: I have. I didn't bring that
25 up. I done that on purpose. I was going to bring that
26 up after we vote on this.
27 CINDY WILSON: Okay. Thank you.
28 TOMMY DUNN: Yes, ma'am. All in favor of
29 the motion show of hands. All opposed. Show the
30 motion carries with Mr. Waters, Mr. Allen, Mr. Dunn,
31 Mr. Cole, Mr. Crowder and Ms. Wilson in favor. Ms.
32 Floyd opposed.
33 At this time I'd like to make a motion to
34 increase the South Carolina Upstate Equine Council for
35 the horse play from three thousand to four thousand.
36 They're picking up a thousand dollars. Put that in the
37 ---
38 GRACIE FLOYD: Point of order, Mr. Chair.
39 TOMMY DUNN: Yes, ma'am.
40 GRACIE FLOYD: The board member must recuse
41 herself.
42 TOMMY DUNN: She is, when I get the
43 motion on the floor.
44 GRACIE FLOYD: Yeah, she's doing it now.
45 Thank you.
46 TOMMY DUNN: Put that in the form of a
47 motion. Have a second?
48 TOM ALLEN: Second.
49 TOMMY DUNN: Second Mr. Allen. Now, let
50 the record show that the motion's on the floor, that

1 Ms. Wilson has recused herself. She's on the board of
2 this. Now, are there any further discussion? Hearing
3 none, all in favor of the motion show of hands. All
4 opposed like sign. Show the motion carries
5 unanimously. Be right back.

6 FRANCIS CROWDER: Oh, I could have done that.
7 I'm sorry. I apologize. Thank you.

8 TOMMY DUNN: Moving on next on the agenda
9 will be Ordinance number 7, third reading 7(a) 2015-035
10 an ordinance to amend an agreement for the development
11 of a Joint County Industrial and Business Park (2010
12 Park) of Anderson and Greenville Counties so as to
13 enlarge the park. We have a motion?

14 CINDY WILSON: So moved.

15 FRANCIS CROWDER: I make a motion.

16 TOMMY DUNN: Motion Mr. Allen and second
17 Mr. Crowder. Any discussion? Mr. Nelson, you have
18 anything you want to add or say?

19 BURRISS NELSON: Nothing other than this is a
20 Greenville project and they're adding property to the
21 Anderson County agreement.

22 TOMMY DUNN: All in favor of the motion
23 show of hands. All opposed like sign. Show the motion
24 carries unanimously.

25 Moving on to Item number 7(b)2015-042 an
26 ordinance authorizing the execution and delivery of an
27 amended and restated Fee in Lieu of tax agreement by
28 and between Anderson County, South Carolina and Watson
29 Engineering, Inc., as sponsor, and 1350 Shiloh
30 Properties, LLC, as sponsor affiliate. We have a
31 motion?

32 TOM ALLEN: So moved.

33 TOMMY DUNN: Motion Mr. Allen.

34 CINDY WILSON: Second.

35 TOMMY DUNN: Second Ms. Wilson. Any
36 discussion? Mr. Nelson, you have anything you want to
37 add?

38 BURRISS NELSON: Mr. Chairman, at the first
39 reading I did not have -- and back at the time when we
40 did Watson Engineering, I didn't do a full project
41 executive summary like I do now. And so this is a full
42 executive summary for the project and shows that
43 there's a capital investment of five point seven three
44 million, eighty-five jobs, seventeen dollars and sixty-
45 eight cents an hour, with an annual payroll -- new
46 payroll of three point -- over three million dollars.
47 This project -- this company's been in existence for
48 thirty-five plus years. They have projects,
49 facilities, manufacturing facilities, not only in South
50 Carolina, but they have them in Detroit, as well. And

1 they've been a long time successful company.
2 This project had additional property increase
3 that needed to be captured in the fee agreement. And
4 so we've asked for a language change that increase --
5 because of increase product demand they had to build a
6 new building, and it wasn't anticipated in the
7 beginning. The new building and its new address had to
8 be captured in the current agreements. And this
9 language change and clean-up does not change the
10 original deal at all. It's all the same; it hasn't
11 changed a bit.

12 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Nelson.

13 BURRISS NELSON: Thank you.

14 TOMMY DUNN: Any more discussion?

15 KEN WATERS: Mr. Chairman?

16 TOMMY DUNN: Mr. Waters?

17 KEN WATERS: Now, this is in addition to
18 the -- what we voted on, what, two or three years ago?

19 BURRISS NELSON: Well, the total capital
20 investment amount is exceeded by a minimum amount by a
21 few hundred thousand dollars. But they still have two
22 years in their investment agreement, plus -- and
23 they've met their amount that they promised in the
24 original agreement. And they've met the jobs creation
25 in the original agreement. They have another five
26 years on top of what they've already accomplished to --
27 for additional capital investment. We certainly are
28 hoping that they will exceed ten, fifteen million in
29 capital investment and create a hundred, hundred and
30 fifty, two hundred and fifty jobs.

31 KEN WATERS: Okay. So this is -- they've
32 already met their expectations and this is -- this
33 exceeds that, is that what I'm hearing?

34 BURRISS NELSON: Well, this gets -- captures
35 and exceeds it by a small amount. But not -- a couple
36 hundred thousand.

37 KEN WATERS: Okay. Not total. Okay. I
38 got you. Appreciate that.

39 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Waters.
40 Anyone else? All in favor of the motion show of hands.
41 All opposed like sign. You in favor of it, Ms. Floyd?

42 GRACIE FLOYD: In favor.

43 TOMMY DUNN: It was unanimous.

44 BURRISS NELSON: Thank you for your support.

45 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you.

46 Moving on to Item number 7(c) 2015-043 an
47 ordinance authorizing the execution and delivery of an
48 amended and restated Special Source Revenue Agreement
49 by and between Anderson County, South Carolina and 125
50 Hollow Properties, LLC, an affiliate of Watson

1 Engineering, Inc. We have a motion?
2 KEN WATERS: I make a motion that we move
3 forward.
4 TOMMY DUNN: Motion Mr. Waters.
5 CINDY WILSON: Second.
6 TOMMY DUNN: Second Ms. Wilson. Any
7 discussion? Mr. Nelson, you got anything to add or
8 say?
9 BURRISS NELSON: This is just additional
10 ordinance for that same project and accomplishes
11 exactly the same thing we discussed already. Thank
12 you, sir.
13 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you. Any more? Any
14 one else? Hearing none, all in favor of the motion
15 show of hands. All opposed like sign. Show the motion
16 carries unanimously.
17 BURRISS NELSON: Thank you.
18 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Nelson.
19 We'll be moving on to Item number 8,
20 Ordinances Second Reading 2015-038 an ordinance to
21 rezone +/- 3.22 acres from I-1 (Industrial) to R-A
22 (Residential-Agriculture) at 10000 BHP Hwy 76 (TMS 251-
23 00-04-019) in Council District #3. We have a motion to
24 move this forward?
25 MITCHELL COLE: So moved.
26 TOMMY DUNN: Motion Mr. Cole. Second Mr.
27 Waters. Any further discussion?
28 GRACIE FLOYD: Yes.
29 TOMMY DUNN: Ms. Floyd?
30 GRACIE FLOYD: Thank you. Mr. Cole, please
31 help me remember this. Is this the same thing that we
32 discussed on the same road where the -- we made an
33 attempt to do this a couple of years ago?
34 TOMMY DUNN: It's not it, Ms. Floyd.
35 MITCHELL COLE: This is a new situation.
36 GRACIE FLOYD: It's a new situation.
37 MITCHELL COLE: Yes, ma'am.
38 GRACIE FLOYD: Okay. It was on first
39 reading last week.
40 MITCHELL COLE: That's correct. A little
41 lady tried to sell the property and since it was zoned
42 incorrectly ????
43 GRACIE FLOYD: I understand. Thank you so
44 much.
45 TOMMY DUNN: Any one else? All in favor
46 of the motion show of hands. All opposed like sign.
47 Show the motion carries unanimously.
48 Moving on to Item number 8(b) 2015-040 An
49 Ordinance to rezone +/- 33.75 acres from R-20 (Single-
50 Family Residential) to R-A (Residential-Agriculture) at

1 5575 Hwy 187 (TMS 027-00-01-003) in Council District
2 #4. Do we have a motion?
3 TOM ALLEN: So moved.
4 KEN WATERS: Second.
5 TOMMY DUNN: Motion Mr. Allen and second
6 Mr. Waters. Any further discussion?
7 GRACIE FLOYD: Yes.
8 TOMMY DUNN: Ms. Floyd?
9 GRACIE FLOYD: Mr. Dunn, is this your
10 district?
11 TOMMY DUNN: No, it'll be Mr. Allen's.
12 GRACIE FLOYD: Okay. Mr. Allen, could you
13 give me a quick refresher, please.
14 TOM ALLEN: Yeah, this is a piece of
15 property up there. The individual simply wants to be
16 allowed to have some animals, some farm animals, some
17 cows, sheep and so on. Nobody's objecting to it. It's
18 ---
19 GRACIE FLOYD: I think that was my
20 question, the neighbors. Okay, good.
21 TOM ALLEN: Yeah. They're fine with it.
22 GRACIE FLOYD: Thank you.
23 TOMMY DUNN: Anyone else? Mr. Forman, I
24 apologize. I didn't recognize you a while ago. You
25 have anything?
26 MICHAEL FORMAN: No, sir.
27 TOMMY DUNN: Okay. All in favor of the
28 motion show of hands. All opposed like sign. Show the
29 motion carries unanimously.
30 Moving on to Item number 9 RESOLUTION 2015-060
31 an ordinance in support of the issuance by the South
32 Carolina Jobs-Economic Development Authority of its
33 Education Facilities Revenue bonds, in one or more
34 series, taxable or tax-exempt, pursuant to the
35 provisions of title 41, chapter 43, of the Code of Laws
36 of South Carolina 1976 as amended, in the principal
37 amount of not exceeding \$33,000,000. This would be a
38 public hearing. For the public hearing, for the TCTC
39 resolution this is a public hearing that is required by
40 the Federal Tax Law regarding the issuance of a Jobs-
41 Economic Development Authority of Education Facility
42 revenue bonds for Tri-County Technical College. We're
43 conducting this public hearing as accommodation to Tri-
44 County Technical College. Anyone wishing to speak on
45 this matter, please come forward, state your name and
46 district and address the Chair, please. It'll be a
47 public hearing. Anyone at all? Hearing anyone?
48 Hearing none, do we have a motion?
49 FRANCIS CROWDER: I make a motion.
50 TOMMY DUNN: Motion Mr. Crowder to move

1 forward and second Ms. Wilson. Do we have any further
2 discussion? Hearing none, all in favor of the motion
3 show of hands. All opposed like sign. Show the motion
4 carries unanimously.
5 Okay. Item number 10, appointments. I
6 believe, y'all correct me if I'm wrong, Mr. Allen's the
7 only one that has one. Mr. Allen?
8 TOM ALLEN: Get my mike on here and get
9 to where I need to be. Yeah, this is an appointment
10 for the Mental Health and Behavior Board and I'd like
11 to appoint Ms. Kelly Bonner as my new appointment to
12 that board. They've been short some members over
13 there. And I put that in the form of a motion.
14 TOMMY DUNN: Have a motion Mr. Allen.
15 Have a second?
16 KEN WATERS: Second.
17 TOMMY DUNN: Second Mr. Waters. Any
18 discussion? Hearing none, all in favor of the motion
19 show of hands. All opposed like sign. Show the motion
20 carries unanimously.
21 Anyone else? Mr. Crowder?
22 FRANCIS CROWDER: Well, actually I had one but
23 it's too late. It came in just actually yesterday.
24 But I will have it on the agenda -- I just want to
25 report it's also for the Behavior Health Service Board,
26 so that when they meet in January, they'll have their
27 membership.
28 TOMMY DUNN: That'll be great.
29 GRACIE FLOYD: Mr. Chairman?
30 TOMMY DUNN: Yes, ma'am.
31 GRACIE FLOYD: May I point out, please,
32 that the gentleman from District 1 doesn't have to do
33 it if he doesn't want to, but it doesn't have to be on
34 the agenda for an -- to do an appointment. It could be
35 brought up that same night, if the Council person wants
36 to do it. But if he doesn't want to, that's fine, too.
37 TOMMY DUNN: That's up to you, Mr.
38 Crowder.
39 FRANCIS CROWDER: Well, I appreciate it, but I
40 just would prefer to wait until the next Council
41 meeting. Thank you.
42 TOMMY DUNN: That'll be fine. Give time
43 to look at the applicant. That'll be great.
44 Moving on, next ---
45 GRACIE FLOYD: Administrator's report.
46 TOMMY DUNN: --- Administrator's report.
47 Thank you, Ms. Floyd.
48 RUSTY BURNS: Nothing at this time, Mr.
49 Chairman.
50 TOMMY DUNN: Next, it's not on the

1 agenda, but it should be, funding. What word am I
2 looking for here? Request from Council members. I'm
3 sorry. Request from Council members. Ms. Wilson, you
4 have any?

5 CINDY WILSON: We don't have it on the
6 agenda, so that may be a dilemma, but I did have one
7 for tonight. I think it was just a mis-communication.

8 TOMMY DUNN: Let's just leave it off. I
9 don't know why it got off. Be simple just to leave it
10 off and we'll take care of it all next Council meeting
11 if that won't be a thing of it. I just caught this.

12 GRACIE FLOYD: Mr. Dunn, if I may?

13 TOMMY DUNN: Yes.

14 GRACIE FLOYD: The agenda can be revised if
15 all members agree to do it, so it can be on that. But
16 I don't know the revision must take place before the
17 meeting, or it could take place now. But I, for one,
18 would vote to amend it so it could placed on there.

19 TOMMY DUNN: I don't think it's that big
20 a -- I got one, too, but I can wait until next Council
21 meeting. Does that suit you, Ms. Wilson, waiting until
22 -- everybody, that going to be a problem? Everybody
23 can't say nothing and move on like that and I
24 appreciate it. We caught that. Next is Item number
25 12, Citizens Comments. Mr. Harmon?

26 LEON HARMON: Mr. Chairman, there are no
27 citizens signed up to speak.

28 TOMMY DUNN: Okay. That sounds -- thank
29 you. Now, we have remarks from Council members. Mr.
30 Waters?

31 KEN WATERS: I don't have any at this
32 time.

33 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Waters. Mr.
34 Allen?

35 TOM ALLEN: Yeah, if -- this is what I
36 call a Council meeting. It's ten till seven, all
37 right. I just want to make note of the fact that this
38 Sunday will be the Christmas parade and Friday night
39 will be the lighting of the magnificent new tree that
40 we have, so I hope that everybody can make it out to
41 that event. Thank you.

42 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Allen. Ms.
43 Floyd?

44 GRACIE FLOYD: I don't have anything.

45 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Ms. Floyd. Mr.
46 Cole?

47 MITCHELL COLE: Nothing at this time.

48 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Cole. Mr.
49 Crowder?

50 FRANCIS CROWDER: I have nothing, Chairman.

1 Thank you.

2 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you. Ms. Wilson?

3 CINDY WILSON: Just a quick compliment for
4 our Civic Center staff and Mr. Brill. They have
5 continued to do an incredible job of getting the
6 campaign candidates through for the presidential
7 primary and from what I've understood, the campaigns
8 have complimented our Civic Center and the folks
9 working out there. In fact, I understood that Mr.
10 Trump's campaign tried to hire some of the people, they
11 did such a good job of setting up and getting people in
12 and out. So we're very blessed and I'm so glad to see
13 that our Civic Center is working really well for public
14 interest. So thank you.

15 TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Ms. Wilson.
16 Lucky they didn't take the job, they might have wanted
17 to hire them so they could say, you're fired. Mr.
18 Crowder?

19 FRANCIS CROWDER: Sir?

20 TOMMY DUNN: Any comments?

21 FRANCIS CROWDER: Oh, no, sir, no comments.

22 TOMMY DUNN: Mr. Cole? Oh, I went that
23 way, hadn't I? Thank you. I just got a couple
24 announcements, housekeeping. Remind everybody December
25 10th from 11:30 to 2 at the Civic Center will be the
26 county employee Christmas luncheon. Everybody's
27 invited. Next Council meeting will be on December the
28 15th at noon for presentation part of the meeting.
29 Regular meeting will start at 12:30. Lunch will be
30 served. Keep that. And this was left at my desk to
31 make this announcement with all due heartburn that it
32 gives me. As we all know Westside High School had a
33 fine year this year, but did lose out and didn't get to
34 finish. The state championship didn't go as well for
35 TL Hanna. But little old Abbeville High School.
36 They're small but they're proud. They're going to the
37 state championship. And want to make sure about that
38 right there. Appreciate everybody and hope everybody
39 has a good holiday. Meeting will be adjourned.
