Dear Ms. Philpot:

I am writing regarding current vacancies on the South Carolina Mining Council "Mining Council". Pursuant to Section 48-21-20, the Mining Council is comprised of eleven members including: the Governor's Representative, State Geologist, Secretary of Commerce or his designee, two representatives of DHEC, three representatives of the mining industry and three representatives from nongovernmental conservation interests. I am attaching a table with a listing of the current Mining Council Membership. The Mining Council is concerned that due to the number of vacancies, the Mining Council may be unable to meet its statutory duties.


Recently, Mr. Roger C. Dunlap tendered his resignation from the Mining Council. With his resignation, there are currently six vacancies on the Mining Council: two DHEC representatives, two representatives of the mining industry as well as two representatives of nongovernmental conservation interests. Of the remaining five members, all are serving under expired terms. Additionally, Mr. James D. Elliot, Jr. who serves in a nongovernmental conservation interest slot has failed to regularly attend Mining Council meetings for the last several years.

I am writing to request that the Governor's Office take steps to fill the vacant positions for the Mining Council. I have attached copies of correspondence previously submitted from the Mining Association regarding nominations they have submitted. Additionally, I have been informed that DHEC has previously submitted the names of their nominations: Ms. Christine Sandford-Coker and Mr. David Scatura. With these nominations, there still exists one vacant industry position due to Mr. Dunlap's resignation. Additionally, due to the lack of participation of Mr. James D. Elliot, Jr., the Mining Council is requesting that the Governor's Office fill that position with another nongovernmental conservationist. At the annual Mining Council Meeting held on January 23, 2015, the Mining Council requested that the Mining Association submit to the

Governor's Office an additional nomination to address the vacancy created by Mr. Dunlap's resignation as well as a new nomination for the position held by Mr. Elliot.
