Strengthening Families Program Expands to 10 Sites in South Carolina

The addition of six sites brings a total of 10 non-profit partners delivering the Strengthening Families Program across the state. The addition increases the number of counties served to 19, completing the network of the Strengthening Families Program across South Carolina.

Legislative Agenda Makes Progress at Statehouse

[H. 4408](#), adding members to the State Child Fatality Advisory Committee, received a favorable report by the House Judiciary Committee. The bill now moves to the House floor for a vote.

[H. 3124](#) received a favorable report by the Senate Judiciary committee. The bill prohibiting employers from punishing or dismissing mandated reporter employees who make a child abuse or neglect report. This bill now moves to the Senate floor.

[H.4665](#), prohibiting child care facilities to administer medication without parental consent, received a favorable report from the House Medical, Military, Public and Municipal Affairs subcommittee. The bill moves to full committee for consideration.

[H. 4386](#), prohibiting texting while driving, received a favorable report by the House Education and Public Works Committee. [H. 3994](#), Read to Succeed, advanced with amendments for teacher training, accountability and reporting requirements for schools. Both bills move to the House floor.
