Quote from Haley press secretary Chaney Adams, "The governor, who is working with state officials and industry leaders to monitor fuel supply issues, today issued an executive order waiving federal transportation regulations to ensure expedited fuel delivery. Consumers can and should purchase fuel as they would normally – and as engineers work to repair pipeline issues, we will continue to monitor developments in the region."

On background: The governor issued an executive order last week to minimize the potential impact of the Colonial pipeline shutdown by waiving hours of service requirements. Today's executive order waives weight and size limitations for load requirements and is attached. These measures will help suppliers deliver gasoline more quickly and efficiently.
