South Carolina:

The journalists will arrive in South Carolina late on Wednesday and will spend three days in the state. They will also visit Washington, D.C. and Houston, TX.

Thursday, May 26:

1:00 PM- Journalists will sit down with Ford Graham, Director of International Strategy and Trade, at Commerce to discuss the “nuts and bolts” of recruiting international companies including incentives offered by the state and process questions.

4:00 PM- Journalists will sit down with the Governor and Secretary Hitt to discuss macro level recruiting questions- CEO relationship building and the state’s personal touches when recruiting international companies. (The reporters have been asked to avoid 2016 presidential questions but will likely show interest in the Governor’s Indian roots.)

Note: The journalists have been told they have 15 mins with the Governor. They have also requested still shots of the Governor and Sec. Hitt.

10:00 AM- Journalists will interview Fred Cartwright, Executive Director of Clemson’s ICAR and receive a tour of the facility.

3:00 PM- Journalists will interview Tushar Chikhliker, head of Nexsen Pruet’s Economic Development group

Journalists will have a “free day” in the Columbia area.
