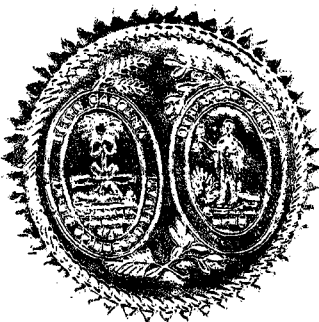
To the Commissioners of Election for Spartanburg County:



WHEREAS, a group of interested citizens of the Piedmont area of South Carolina have expressed a desire to utilize the benefits provided by the Act, and



Now, therefore,


PURSUANT TO THE LAW OF THIS STATE AND BY VIRTUE OF THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME, I do hereby establish the South Carolina Appalachian Advisory Committee, a non profit entity, whose members shall be selected from the participating counties, for the purpose of coordinating the various Appalachian programs to serve the best interest of the South Carolina Appalachian region, its people and its resources.

The Council shall be the official agency of the South Carolina Appalachian region to receive and disburse any funds made available by the Federal Government for programs relating to the "Appalachian Regional Development Act of 1965."

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 3


WHEREAS, the constantly increasing proportion of older people within the population of this State, and the increasing gravity of the human distress, and the loss accruing to the entire society as a result of the limitations and disadvantages confronting older people in maintaining their economic self-sufficiency and personal well-being, and realizing their maximum potentials as contributors to their community, state, and nation, are matters of profound import and concern for all people of this State; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and of the utmost importance to encourage the development and maintenance within this State of a comprehensive and coordinated network of public and private facilities for the correction or alleviation of these limitations and disadvantages and to encourage the conducting of continuous study and research into the needs and problems of older people under present and future economic and social conditions because it

sion, the Director of the State Development Board, the State Director of Vocational Rehabilitation, the Director of the Clemson University Extension Service and the Executive Director of the South Carolina Municipal Association; and ten of whom shall be appointed by the Governor who shall be citizens of the State and who have an interest in and a knowledge of the problems of the aging, and at least one member shall reside in each of the six congressional districts of the State. This Council shall be for the purpose of coordinating programs to serve the best interest of the aging of the State.

The Council shall be the designated State agency to receive and disburse any funds made available by the Federal Government for programs relating to the "Older Americans Act of 1965."



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 4



WHEREAS, a group of South Carolina citizens interested in the fine arts have expressed a desire to utilize the benefits provided by the Act, and



Now, therefore,



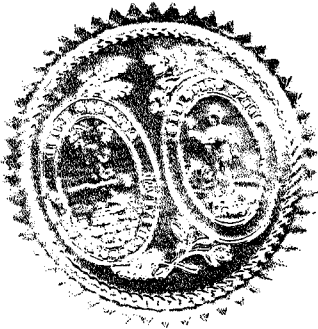

WHEREAS, South Carolina has numerous sites and abundant materials of historical value and significance, and

WHEREAS, numerous citizens have expressed an interest in the preservation and development of these sites and information about them, and have recommended the creation of a statewide historic resources inter-agency council,


Now, therefore,

PURSUANT TO THE LAW OF THIS STATE AND BY VIRTUE OF THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME, I do hereby establish the South Carolina Historic Resources Inter-Agency Council, a non-profit entity, whose members shall be the Director of the Archives Department, the Chief Highway Commissioner, the Director of the State Development Board, the Director of Wildlife Resources, the State Forester, the State Archaeologist, and the Dean of the School of Architecture of Clemson University, or their designees. The purpose of the Council shall be to utilize the capacities of the individual departments for the preservation and development of the historic resources of the State with the view toward the education of the citizens of South Carolina and the attraction of visitors from other states.

The Executive Council of the Confederation of South Carolina Local Historical Societies shall act as an Advisory Council to this Council.

The South Carolina Historic Resources Inter-Agency Council shall be an official agency of South Carolina to receive and disburse any funds made available by the Federal Government or private source for the realization of the purposes of the Council.
