### NASUAD Publishes Updated State Medicaid Integration Tracker

NASUAD has published the **April 2017** Edition of the State Medicaid Integration Tracker. The State Medicaid Integration Tracker is a monthly report summarizing state actions in Managed Long Term Services and Supports (MLTSS), as well as State Demonstrations to Integrate Care for Dual Eligible Individuals and other Medicare-Medicaid Coordination Initiatives.

The Tracker also includes updates on state participation in other LTSS activities, including: the Balancing Incentive Program; Medicaid State Plan Amendments under 1915(i); Community First Choice Option under 1915(k); and Medicaid Health Homes. This tracker includes new updates for each state that occurred during the most recent month.

### Disability Network Business Acumen Environmental Scan Survey

In the fall of 2016, the Administration for Community Living (ACL) awarded the National Association of States United for Aging and Disabilities (NASUAD) a cooperative agreement aimed at building the capacity of community-based disability organizations (CBOs) to contract with integrated care and other health sector entities. Along with our partners in this Disability Network Business Acumen project, we at NASUAD are asking for your input to help provide a baseline foundation of knowledge for this effort.

The growing trend nationwide to integrate healthcare and long term services and supports is creating exciting opportunities for CBOs open to operating in new ways. It is clear that CBOs know their communities well and are experts regarding the issues their clients face, yet organizations may need support in developing their business acumen expertise. The Disability Network Business Acumen project is conducting an environmental scan to better understand the business needs and strengths of CBOs and states serving persons of all ages with disabilities of all types.

This comprehensive environmental scan survey (see link below) will serve as the foundation for the development of tools and resources that NASUAD and its partners will design to help organizations improve

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their ability to work with managed care organizations, accountable care organizations, and other health systems. This survey is intended to ensure that state and community-based organizations serving people with disabilities are part of the evolving service delivery system and that their significant knowledge and experience serving people with disabilities is preserved.

We invite state agencies, CBOs that serve persons with disabilities, and managed care organizations to complete the environmental scan [survey](#). The survey will be available for completion through **May 2017**. Your survey responses will be integral to the success of the project.

The Request for Proposals (RFP) from AARP seeks to identify multi-disciplinary coalitions positioned to assist AARP with its BankSafe initiative. BankSafe aims to protect consumers from financial exploitation and keep retirement savings safe. AARP is seeking to partner with the financial industry to create a free online training program that will help employees in local financial institutions to detect and prevent exploitation. The purpose of this grant is to fund multi-disciplinary, multi-stakeholder collaborative groups (composed of aging advocates that are working in conjunction with financial institutions) to help develop the content of the training, which should include state-specific content.

Selected coalitions will receive a grant of \$10,000 to help develop and disseminate training to banks and credit unions.
