The above Plot represents the form & Shape of a Plot in Charleston known by the number 157 containing an half acre & 450 Square feet Divided by the Curtain of the Fortification and a Passage to the Parsonage The Southernmost Part of Which Butts and Bounds N. W. on the fence of the Rampart N. E. on the Southernmost Part of the Plot Number 155 So. Eastward on the Plot Number 263 and S. W. on Archdale Street The Northernmost Part Butts & Bounds N. W. on Plot No. 158 N. E. on the Northernmost Part Plot No. 155 So. E. on the Passage to the Parsonage upon the Center Scarp and S. W. on Archdale Street George Hunter Esquire Late Sur. General in his Town Plat Certified June the 3^d 1746 Divides the Plot between Archdale Queen & King Streets In Equal Width and Depts Each 95 feet by 234 feet & says the Plot No. 157 to be Divided by the Fortifications and bis it. Northernmost Part Down 30 feet Wide and its Southernmost Part 45 feet Wide according to which Plat by request made to me I have laid out the Same and have Represented it in the above Plat Certified and Given under my Hand the Day of Anno Domini 1756.
