On Lot No 158 N.E. on the Northernmost Part Lot No 155. So. E. on the Passage to the Parsonage upon the Counter Scarpe and S. W. on Archdale Street George Hunter Esquire Late Surv. General in his Town Plat Certified June the 3, 1746 Divides the Lot between Archdale Queen & King Streets In Equal Width and Depths Each 95 feet by 234 feet & Saws the Lot No 157 to be Divided by the Fortifications and has its Northernmost Part Down 50 feet wide and its Southernmost Part 45 feet wide according to which Plat by request made to me I have laid out the same and have Represented it in the above Plat Certified and Given under my Hand the Day of June D^r 1756.
