Special Program: History of Yamasee Indians

Saturday, June 16 at 1pm, the Santa Elena History Center welcomes Dr. Eric Poplin to give a presentation on the origins and migrations of the Yamasee Indians. It will incorporate some of the most recent research, and includes a brief overview of the Yamasee War and a short discussion of the evolution of Yamasee pottery.

Dr. Eric Poplin is a Senior Archaeologist/Vice President with Brockington and Associates and has conducted archaeological investigations throughout coastal South Carolina for the last 28 years. Recent research interests include changes in Altamaha pottery, recovered from numerous sites occupied by the Yamasee Indians in South Carolina.

The FREE shuttle around downtown Beaufort continues!
