Thank you for reaching out to us before attempting any foraging. All too often we experience an "ask for forgiveness" attitude.

To answer your question, we do not allow the mushroom harvesting on our park lands. We only allow specimens to be collected for scientific research through our permitting system. Many things in our forests also want to eat those mushrooms. Protecting the mushrooms along with the creatures that depend on them are part of our mission of stewardship.

If you would like to forage for mushrooms, I would suggest reaching out to the National Forest. They have foraging permits open to the public. Below is a link to the National Forest in Western North Carolina that allow harvesting. The rules vary from area to area so check with the local office for the Francis Marion National Forest in South Carolina.
