Subject: Re: EMD Alert - Flooding

Rain will continue to fall throughout the state today but in most places taper off this evening and [tomorrow](#).

From the Midlands north NWS has posted flash flood watches and several rivers are at or near flood stage including the Saluda near Greenville, Stevens Creek at Modoc, Savannah River near Clyo, Congaree at Eastman, Santee near Jamestown, Saluda at Chappels, Enoree at Whitmire, Pee Dee at Cheraw, Black Creek near Quinby, Pee Dee at Pee Dee, and Little Pee Dee at Galivants Ferry. All are or will be at minor flood levels with the exception of the Congaree, Stevens Creek, and the Pee Dee at Cheraw who are all forecast to be in the low end of moderate flooding. However, flood impacts are not expected to be significant but could cause localized road closures.

The Warning Point received no county updates or requests for state assistance last night but will continue to monitor the situation.

EMD reports that most issues are in the Midlands area:

- ? Fairfield County has evacuated one home. That family is staying with another family member.
- ? Greenwood County has two secondary roads closed due to a dam overtopping.
- ? Kershaw County has at least two roads closed in Elgin. No other issues at this time.
- ? Newberry County has minor flooding on some roads, but no major issues at this time.
- ? Lexington County has reported several roads were experiencing some flooding this morning. No major issues at this time.
- ? Richland County has no issues at the dam near Farrow Road (the spillway is working and not flooding like people are reporting). DHEC has been notified.

No state assistance has been requested from any county.
