Commerce Capture: Trident Technical College

**Trident Technical College** is a public, two-year, multi-campus community college. The school serves approximately 17,000 traditional and non-traditional curriculum students in programs such as arts and sciences, agriculture, business, computer techn

technology, health sciences, industrial technology and public service. Trident Tech also offers four airplane-related diploma certificate tracks to assist with training Boeing employees in aviation and aerospace. In 2013, the college announced a \$79 million aeronautical training center at its North Charleston campus. The 215,000-square-foot space would will help for the aeronautical cluster in the region and state, including Boeing South Carolina and its suppliers and vendors.
