Good morning:

I thought you'd like to see the summary of aging funding approved by Congress this week.

NASUAD released a summary of the omnibus budget measure, which will Fund the government through September 2018. Some of the services that increased funding include: ADRCs, *SHIPs, HCBS supportive services, and HCBS supportive services (III-B).

*SHIPs received a partial increase, but not complete, restoration of prior cuts to a current funding level of \$49.1. This is \$2 million higher than FY2017 but still below previous levels that were in excess of \$50 million

Dear NASUAD Members:

Last night, Congress released the text of a comprehensive appropriations bill that would provide funding for the federal government through the remainder of the fiscal year, which runs until September 30, 2018. Although some legislators, including members of the House Freedom Caucus, have publicly opposed the legislation, the bipartisan negotiations and subsequent press releases indicate that the bill will ultimately pass as written. This afternoon, the House passed the bill on a 256-167 vote and the Senate is expected to clear it before tomorrow's deadline.

Attached, please find our memo with more detail on the process and funding highlights from the legislation, as well as our detailed tables that outline funding levels for key aging and disability programs.
