Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Awards

The Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Program is a merit-based scholarship program designed to recognize the most academically talented high school seniors in S.C., encourage them to attend college in the State, and help retain talented minority students who might otherwise pursue studies outside the State. Each Palmetto Fellow may receive a scholarship of up to \$5,000 per year for a maximum of eight full-time terms. The scholarship must be applied towards the cost-of-attendance to pursue the first baccalaureate degree at a participating public or private senior institution in the State.

In order to be eligible to apply for a Palmetto Fellows Scholarship, a student must meet the following minimum academic requirements: (1) score at least 1200 on the SAT or 27 on the ACT; (2) earn a 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale at the end of the junior year; and (3) rank in the top five percent of the class at the end of either the sophomore or the junior year. The selection process is very competitive since the Commission on Higher Education usually receives more qualified applicants than available funding. For the 2001 cohort, the Commission on Higher Education received 1172 Palmetto Fellows Scholarship applications and 712 new scholarships were awarded. The average SAT score was 1316 and the average ACT score was 29. 270 students (38%) ranked number one or number two in their class.

For the 2000-01 Academic Year, 2633 Palmetto Fellows were funded and \$12.5 million was disbursed. The following report provides: number of Palmetto Fellows and amount awarded per institution for the 2000 Fall and 2001 Spring terms; 1999-2000 retention statistics; 2001 Palmetto Fellows awarded to African-Americans; 2001 Palmetto Fellows awarded by institution; 2001 applicants by county of origin; and, 2001 new recipients by county of origin.




