State-Wide Day of Prayer – Tuesday, November 22, 2016

Gov. Nikki Haley will pray at Emanuel A.M.E. Church on Tuesday, November 22, 2016 at 12noon as part of a request that residents across the state join her in an organized show of faith that day.

At noon on Nov. 22, Haley wants South Carolinians to pray for the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday, as well as for the lingering effects of Hurricane Matthew, according to a press release from the governor's press office.

Additionally, she noted "two significant criminal trials are underway in Charleston," referring to the murder trial of former police officer Michael Slager of motorist Walter Scott and the EAMEC case where self-avowed white supremacist Dylann Roof is charged with killing nine black worshipers.

"Faith, prayer and helping our neighbors is what got us through a challenging time last year, and those things will get us through these two trials and the aftermath of the hurricane," Haley said.

"In South Carolina, we know how to have compassion toward each other, count our blessings, and remember that we are one state, one people," she added.

She did not refer to the fallout recently seen from last week's divisive presidential election.

This is the first time in her six years in office she has sponsored such an event.

COLUMBIA, S.C. As South Carolinians prepare for Thanksgiving and the holiday season, Governor Nikki Haley announced a day of prayer vigils throughout the state on Tuesday, November 22, 2016.

The governor, working together with leaders of the faith community, urges everyone, regardless of their faith or denomination, to pray for continued strength and healing across the state and give thanks for the state's blessings. Prayer vigils will be held in individual places of worship at 12:00 PM when bells will ring in observance of services statewide.
