Obama to Release \$4 Trillion-Plus Budget for 2017

ABC News: President Barack Obama is unveiling his eighth and final budget, a \$4 trillion-plus proposal that's freighted with liberal policy initiatives and new and familiar tax hikes — all sent to a dismissive Republican-controlled Congress that simply wants to move on from his presidency.

The budget will be released Tuesday morning, the same day as the New Hampshire primary when it's likely to get little attention. It comes as the deficit, which had been falling over the duration of Obama's two terms, has begun to creep up, above the half-trillion mark.

Government Executive: Democrats and Republicans agree on the need to cut the federal budget by about \$50 billion in fiscal 2017, according to a new survey.

The poll, conducted by the Program for Public Consultation at the University of Maryland's School of Public Policy, found majorities in both parties -- when provided with background information on the subject -- support an overlap of \$10 billion in specific areas in which to cut. That includes a \$3 billion reduction in subsidies to agricultural corporations, \$1 billion at the departments of State and Justice, \$1 billion at intelligence agencies and the same amount to Overseas Contingency Operations. A majority of all respondents agreed to trim "federal enforcement of federal laws" by \$1 billion.
