Description/Significant Features:

The houses at 42 Bomway St. and 152/154 Bomway St. are examples of the duplex type compact Ranch houses in the Barnwell Heights Neighborhood. These one-story houses have side-gable roof clad in asphalt shingles, clapboard siding, a combination of brick and clapboard siding, and continuous concrete block foundations. The window types are typical of period Ranch houses, including three-part picture windows and two-over-two horizontal sash windows. The houses have symmetrical facades and are rectangular in shape with separate entrances for each living area.

Historical Information:

These houses are located in the Barnwell Heights Neighborhood, which was established in 1951 to provide worker housing for the nearby NRHP-eligible Savannah River site (SRS). They were designed by the South Carolina architectural firm of Lyles, Bissett, Carlisle & Wolff in partnership with Atlanta-based landscape architect and planning consultant Eugene R. Martini. The neighborhood was built following passage of Public Law 139, "The Defense Housing and Community Facilities and Services Act," which spurred the construction of housing developments built in communities around SRS.
