David,

I just confirmed that we sell information to the Selective Service twice a year. They request from each state DMV the names, addresses, dates of birth, and SSN for men between the ages of 17-21. We actually provide them with the following information:

Name, Date of Birth, Address, Date of Record

We do not provide them with the SSN.

Before 12/18/00, this information was provided at no charge. We have priced the header file at \$10 per record. They receive around 200,000 records per request. As a result, their price will increase from \$0 to \$2,000,000 per request.

Should information sold from the header file be priced at \$0.10 per record? Is this the same type of sale as the prior month's violation tape or a tag inquiry? These products are priced at \$0.10. Currently, only the Selective Service and a few county governmental units purchase the header file information. The sale of this product is very limited do to DPPA.

We currently sell the Selective Service updates of new licensees to our driver file in the age group 18-26. They use this information to help determine eligibility and verification of address so they can notify. This legislation would require us to notify males 18-26 (on our form) that their information is going to be forwarded to selective service and they are consenting to registration either now or when they become eligible. I am sure there are all types of legal issues here I could never hope to understand. However, from an operational standpoint we need to change our forms, decide if we should tell the individual what they are agreeing to and do we start giving this information away.
