PROCLAMATION WORDING: (Ashton has the framed proclamation)

WHEREAS, high-quality schools enable our young people to obtain the knowledge and develop the skills necessary to fill their position as the leaders of tomorrow; and

WHEREAS, an effective and accountable system of education plays a critical role in helping our children to be successful in a global economy; and

WHEREAS, South Carolina offers many outstanding education choices for students and parents, including public schools, public charter, magnet, and virtual schools, independent schools, and homeschooling, as well as exceptional teaching professionals who are committed to educating the children in our state; and

WHEREAS, providing children with multiple schooling options can help improve academic performance.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim January 25 – 31, 2015, as

SOUTH CAROLINA SCHOOL CHOICE WEEK

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to improve the quality of education and expand access to highly effective schools for young people in the Palmetto State.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS:

- I have always said that the best way to a brighter future for South Carolina is through the education of our children, because they are our future workforce.
- We showed how dedicated we are to this cause when we were able to pass landmark education reform through the General Assembly last year, but we didn't stop there. Our Executive Budget this

- year proposes another round of investments that would further our state's commitment to our young people.
- But another way to make sure we are providing the best instruction possible for each individual child is to give them a choice as to where and how they are educated.
- There are currently 66 public charter schools in South Carolina serving approximately 26,000 students and growing.
- We're making considerable progress. In the Education Reform Initiative last year, we proposed, and the General Assembly supported, efforts to **increase per-student subsidies for students attending brick and mortar charter schools from \$3,250 to \$3,600 and for those attending virtual charters from \$1,700 to \$1,900.**
- And with the passage of Act 288 of 2014, charters will have the opportunity to take on our state's most challenging students without fear of reprisal, but charters will also generally be required to meet the same, if not higher, standards than their counterparts statewide.
- **According to a new report from the National Alliance for Public Charter Schools, released today, South Carolina is now ranked 10th in the country for its charter school laws.**
- By making these changes, we're enhancing choice for our families. We're moving in the right direction and South Carolina's school children are the big winners.
- But there's more to do if we're going to continually improve our rankings.
- That's why the budget I released a few weeks ago continues our strong support of charter schools.
- **Specifically, we propose nearly \$12 million additional (21% increase over last year's act) in recurring funds to support continued growth in the Public Charter School District and nearly \$3 million to support development and expansion of the Department's virtual education program.**
- The success and development of the South Carolina's charter schools is a testament to how a small group of dedicated parents, educators, and policymakers can transform the landscape of education in the state for the better.
