In the midst of our sadness, we are profoundly grateful that due to the rapid response of law enforcement and support of the community the suspect has been apprehended. This arrest marks a starting point on the road towards justice and healing of the church, the families most affected and the entire community. But it is only the first step.

During the course of its storied history, Mother Emanuel AME Church has shown remarkable resilience and grace even in the face of adversity. Its congregants rebuilt the church from the ashes after it was burned to the ground in 1822, four short years after its founding. Throughout its almost 200 year history, Mother Emanuel has served as a beacon on of hope, endurance, rebirth, courage and solace to those who face adversity. We can lead with love, compassion and unity. The bonds of love that unite the entire Charleston Community will now ensure that this light is not extinguished by one hateful and depraved act.
