SUMMARY REPORT

Meeting of Commission on Higher Education, May 3, 1984

ANNUAL REVIEW OF MASTER PLAN

The Commission approved a listing of subjects to be addressed in the 1984 Annual Review of the Master Plan for Higher Education and a schedule for preparing the Review.

NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The following new academic programs were approved: (1) Associate in Industrial Technology with a Major in Climate Control Technology, Denmark Technical College; (2) Associate in Industrial Technology with a Major in Machine Tool Technology, Denmark Technical College; (3) Associate in Business with a Major in Materials Management Technology, Greenville Technical College; (4) Associate in Engineering Technology with a Major in Automated Manufacturing Technology, Greenville Technical College; (5) Associate in Engineering Technology with a Major in Process Control/Instrumentation Technology, Greenville Technical College; (6) Associate in Engineering Technology with a Major in Engineering Graphics Technology, Midlands Technical College; (7) B.S. in Biochemistry, College of Charleston; (8) B.S.B.A. in Real Estate, University of South Carolina-Columbia; (9) M.S. in Individual and Family Development, South Carolina State College; (10) Center for Economic Education, Lander College; (11) Center for Economic Research, Clemson University; (12) Center for Semiconductor Device Reliability, Clemson University; (13) Entry Level Doctorate (Pharm.D.) and Non-Entry Level Four-Year B.S. with a Major in Pharmaceutical Sciences, University of South Carolina-Columbia; and (14) Ph.D. in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, University of South Carolina. The Commission deferred consideration of a proposed Center for Effective Teaching, Winthrop College.

OTHER ACADEMIC MATTERS

In other academic matters, the Commission approved the following: (1) Procedures for Administering Quality Improvement Grants for Faculty Development, 1984-85; (2) Procedures for Administering Teacher Improvement Grants, 1984-85; (3) Areas for Quality Improvement Initiatives, 1985-86; and (4) Schedule of Programs to be Evaluated in 1984-85 through 1986-87. The Commission also approved the use of the provisional license for institutions to operate in South Carolina, without specific limitations on the number of renewals.

The following reports were presented to the Commission as information: (1) Report on Follow-up on Evaluation of Degree Programs in Business, 1981-82; (2) Report on Status of Articulation Project; and (3) Final Report on Downtown Campus of Trident Technical College.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS TO JOINT BOARD FOR HEALTH AND MEDICAL EDUCATION
