The Commission also approved the transfer of 1944-45 appropriation  
for the office of the State Bank Examiners as follows:

The Commission declined to approve at this meeting an application by the Superintendent of the South Carolina Sanatorium for a transfer of \$10,000.00 from maintenance to permanent improvements. The Superintendent who appeared before the Commission in support of this request explained that it was desired to construct a residence for doctors employed at the Sanatorium. The Commission instructed the Superintendent to investigate the cost of the proposed building and report back at a subsequent meeting.

An allotment of \$2,000.00 to the State Board of Health for the employment of a Clerk - Emergency Medical Service, at a salary of \$1,800.00 and for the purchase of office supplies up to \$200.00 was approved by the Commission for the fiscal year 1944-45 from the 1944-45 Civil Contingent Fund.

The Commission received and considered a request from Senator R. M. Jefferies that an allotment be made from the Civil Contingent Fund sufficient to operate the State Planning Board until the convening of the next General Assembly. The Commission took the position that it should not provide funds for this purpose since provisions for the operation of the State Planning Board have been definitely refused by the General Assembly for the next fiscal year, but instructed the Secretary to investigate the matter of keeping one employee in the office of the State Planning Board for sometime for the purpose of answering requests for bulletins and other information.

A list of salaries proposed to be paid by the State Department of Public Welfare for the month of June, 1944 and for the fiscal year 1944-45 was considered and approved by the Commission as submitted.

The Commission then adjourned.
