TIDBIT! Most warblers have migrated on to tropical locations for the winter -- but one species that resides here all year is the Pine Warbler. Females are a rather drab olive-gray and may have some faint yellow. Males tend to be much brighter yellow, especially on the throat and undersides. Pine Warblers will visit suet feeders during the winter months and their song is a rapid musical trill. Have you seen one?
