Watch Model Participants will learn about the 5-point strategy to combat the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC), used in Alameda County, California. The 5-point strategy includes: 1) Law Enforcement Training; 2) Aggressive Prosecution of Offenders; 3) Engaging Policymakers and Lawmakers; 4) Coordinating Services for Victims; and 5) Raising Community Awareness.
