Introducing Invite a Colleague Functionality!

We are constantly working to improve the Community of Practice, and today we're introducing a very exciting feature: Invite a Colleague.

With Invite a Colleague, we're allowing you, the practitioners, to help grow the community. If you have coworkers to whom you would like to give access to the Community, or professional acquaintances you think would be a good addition, then this feature makes inviting them simple. We're letting you be the judge of who you think would make a good addition to the community. We're not limiting access in any way.

Inviting colleagues is straightforward. First, simply [go to the Invite Page](#) on the Community. The first field asks for a list of email addresses. For every person you want to invite, simply put their email address in this field. Separate them with a comma, or by putting each email on a new line. Finally, hit the send button, and the Community will automatically give those you invite full access to the Community of Practice. All they have to do is complete the registration form, and they'll be ready to go!
